The ICC cum Hospital is equipped with all vital health facilities, such as the state-of-the art facility with emergency treatment unit, isolation sections, resuscitation units, ICU, medical stores, etc to face with any contingency in the wake of resurgence of the 3rd COVID-19 wave in the country with the intention of giving the best emergency healthcare to affected Sri Lankans free of charge.

The project was fully backed by the Army Seva Vanitha Unit (ASVU), especially with the directions of Mrs Sujeewa Nelson, President, ASVU in providing all necessary accessories, utensils, tools, linen, flasks, cups and plates, pillows, etc. and all the requirements of the patients.



The Deputy Commandant and Senior Staff Officers of the SLAVF also attended the occasion.










Respect each other

In addition to the said basic training, a newly introduced session is in progress in order to update the knowledge of the young recruits on the modern world. Specially, the Chief of Defence Staff and Commander of the Army General Shavendra Silva WWV RWP RSP VSV USP ndc psc MPhil has instructed all the commandants of the training schools to pay especial attention in this regard because the newly recruit soldiers are to perform both basic and secondary role and tasks since there's no war in the country. Since the present Commander of the Army has paid a special attention on uplifting the infrastructure



TREE PLANTING CAMPAIGN AT NANDANKANDAL ARMY CAMP



Luckily there was a garage nearby and after inspecting the vehicle, the mechanic at the garage told me that it might take about 2 to 3 hours to rectify the trouble. Then I decided to use public transport to cover the rest of the journey and directed my driver and assistant soldier to get it rectified and report to Matara camp.

Wellawaya bus stand was so crowded with weekend travellers and other passengers. I had to remain in the queue for a few minutes waiting for a bus. Then an already crowded bus came from Moneragala and stopped at the halt. With the arrival of the bus, the bus halt turned to a pandemonium with people shouting and grappling. I managed to resist and got into the bus hardly finding a space to keep my feet while my body was subjected to bending, pressing, hanging and leaning to maintain my equilibrium among the standing crowd amounting to the double the passengers who were seated. In a few minutes, bus started heading towards Matara along the harsh and dusty Wellawaya - Matara Road.

I started my journey cursing the entire transport system in the country while inhaling the smell of various kinds of perfumes mixed with sweat and spirits emanated from the passengers packed in the bus. Suddenly I noticed one passenger sitting in the seat beside me gazed at me with a friendly smile and seemed to be wanting to talk to me. I reciprocated him with a smile trying to recollect him. But nothing came to my mind about him. Suddenly he gestured me that he wanted to offer his seat to me. I was elated and flopped down on the seat thanking him with a broad smile. I thought he was about to get down. But until the bus reached Hambantota, he did not get down from the bus. Then I assumed that he is a kind hearted and considerate gentleman who wanted to share his seat. So I requested him to take his turn. Nevertheless, he politely denied the request.

By the time the bus reached Dikwella, many passengers had got down from the bus allowing this gentleman to sit next to me. Though I was bit sleepy, I had a strong urge to talk to this large hearted gentleman. I asked him why he offered me his seat despite he had to travel the entire journey. In reply, he asked me, "Sir, are you from the forces"? While telling him "Yes" with my rank and name, I questioned him whether he knows me. With some respectful tone he said that he is a retired soldier and never worked

with me or knew me. But with my features he had guessed that I am a military officer. Further he went on to say "Sir, how can I sit comfortably when one of our officers is travelling standing uncomfortably?" I felt proud and honoured for this retired disciplined soldier.

On reaching the bus to Matara bus stand both of us got down from the bus. While walking with him out of the bus halt I noticed that this ex-soldier is limping. When I asked him why he was limping, he simply said that he is an amputee. I was shocked and asked him indignantly, why he offered me his seat despite his disability. He simply laughed and said " අපේ සර් කෙනෙක් නිටගෙන යද්දි මට වාඩිවෙලා යන්න නිතදුන්නේ නෑ සර්." (Heart did not allow me to be seated when one of ours standing Sir) I pat on his back gently and said goodbye to him. While waiting for the car to pick me to be taken home at the seaside in front of the bus stand, I lit a cigarette with contended mood thinking that "How lucky I am to be an officer of such a disciplined army fortified with disciplined and considerate soldiers" thanking my destiny once again for making me a military officer.

The books flashback the untiring effort and heroism of the war heroes who sacrificed their lives at the face of enemies. Each and every member of the Army as well as the Sri Lankans who spend their lives in a peaceful environment should read these masterpieces in order to experience the genuine physical and mental agony endured by the soldiers in the dreadful battlefield.


Northern and Eastern lands of the island, which were covered with the horror of three decades embedded with long brutal war, stay calm and silence at present. Numerous hidden and untold stories of unpopular heroes are buried under the concrete layers which have been covered the Northeastern soil with the commencement of giant development projects. The praiseworthy effort of the writer who tried to voice those unvoiced brave hearts whose footprints, tears, blood, sighs of sorrow had been hidden forever, is to be absolutely admired.







LTTE attack took place in July 1996 is one of the crucial drawbacks faced by the Army during the three decades of war history. Approximately 1,400 soldiers sacrificed their lives and the damages caused for the properties of the Army was numerous. However, the most unknown factor is that there were many soldiers who fought against the terrorists in fearless manner until their last breath and few of them were able to save their lives and returned to the own force despite the matter how powerful the enemy was. Amongst the few those who saved their lives, were an officer from the 6th Vijayabahu Regiment and 20 other soldiers. Ten of them were able to save their lives by hidding inside an abundant cement tank placed on a roof of a small house situated in the middle of the camp. The soldiers, who spent number of days with no food or a drop of water, were able to save their lives by walking nearly 30 km for weeks and weeks due to their infinite commitments and dedication.



Kokavil Attack in 1990 was the most dreadful and sensitive incident in the Sri Lankan war history. Amongst the 61 personnel who were performing duties at the Kokavil Transmission Tower, 54 soldiers and 4 civilians sacrificed their lives and only 3 of them managed to save their lives. The soldiers who were with inadequate food, drinking water and ammunitions for 26 days fought against the terrorist until the last breath despite the orders given to them to vacate the camp, since they were reluctant to leave the wounded soldiers in the camp. Lieutenant Saliya Aladeniya who led the said operation was posthumously promoted to rank of Captain and honoured with a Parama Weera Vibhushanaya, being the first officer to be awarded with Parama Weera Vibhashanaya in the Sri Lankan history.



Water flowing from exterior - Tears (tears for the dead heroes)


Pond - Strength (unity and togetherness on behalf of the dead heroes)


