




The formal and elegant Guard of Honour parade with four squads of the Russian Land Forces together with a Russian Army Band offered the grand military honours to the visiting military dignitary from Sri Lanka.

During the stay in the Russian Federation, Chief of Defence Staff and Commander of the Sri Lanka Army visited the Moscow Higher

Combined Arms Command School and met its Commandant, Major General Roman Binyukov, Division Commander of the 4th Guards Tank Division in Naro-Fominsk and the Commandant at Mikhailovskaya before he visited the Military Artillery Academy, Military Medical Academy and several other places of military and tourist importance.

The visit of Chief of Defence Staff and Commander of the Sri Lanka Army was declared at the invitation of General of the Russian Army, Oleg Salyukov who visited Sri Lanka in February 2020.

The Moscow Higher Combined Arms Command School is a higher military educational institution of the Russian Armed Forces, formed in December 1917 as the 1st Moscow Revolutionary Machine Gun Officers' School which later became the Higher Combined Arms Command School in Moscow. The school is designed to train Commanding Officers and Military Engineers with higher professional education to conduct fundamental and applied scientific research aimed at solving the problems of strengthening the country's defence capability improving the professional education of military personnel.

Russian and Sri Lankan Army Chiefs Revitalised Bonds of Goodwill Recalling Historic Relations...

With the uprising of the Covid-19 pandemic around the world, scientists and medical experts are highly committed to finding a solution to eradicate the Coronavirus or at least to minimalise its spread by strengthening the human immune system which will help to reduce the death toll and further transmission of the virus. After a strenuous struggle of medical experts throughout the globe, finally found out a vaccination as a solution, for the time being, to reduce the death rate. With this many countries focus their attention on manufacturing different kinds of vaccines which followed by the vaccination drives in countries all over the world.

In the Sri Lankan context, the 1st vaccine consignment consisted of 500,000 AstraZeneca Covishield vaccines that arrived from India as a donation on 28 January 2021. This consignment gifted by the Indian government was received at the Bandaranaike International Airport with a brief reception, graced by HE the President Gotabaya Rajapaksa and HE the High Commissioner of India Mr. Gopal Baglay, strengthening the friendship and bilateral ties among the two nations.

On the following day, (29 January 2021) immunisation programme of Sri Lanka was inaugurated under the direction of the HE the President and the medical experts in the frontline of the COVID-19 prevention battle. According to the reports of the Epidemiology Unit of Ministry of Health in Sri Lanka on 29 January 2021, the vaccine has been given to 5286 frontliners of the Covid-19 battle at the National Hospital of Sri

Lanka (1886), Colombo North Teaching Hospital (803), Colombo South Teaching Hospital (781), Army Hospital (600), Army Camp Panagoda (400), for Children in Lady Ridgeway Hospital (382), Base Hospital, Homagama (190), Base Hospital, Mulleriyawa (108) and Infectious Disease Hospital (80).

Presently, the vaccination programme is operating in several centres located in different parts of the country giving Covishield, Sinopharm, Sputnik - V, Pfizer and Moderna vaccines. Further, with the invaluable commitment of the medical experts of tri-forces, Public Health Inspectors and all the employees in the health-related entities, Sri Lanka was able to reach a milestone by fully vaccinating 50% of the population of the country.

In a critical atmosphere with the widespread of the virus throughout the country, Tri-forces of Sri Lanka provide their fullest and fervid commitment towards vaccine the people of the nation under the direction of HE, the President and the leadership of Chief of Defence Staff, Commander of the Army and Head of the National Operation Centre for Prevention of COVID-19 Outbreak (NOCPKO).

Sri Lanka Army, as a disciplined and efficient resourceful organisation in the country, commenced a vaccination programme on 29 January 2021 at the Army Hospital Colombo. Medical experts and medical staff of the Sri Lanka Army extended their hands to the vaccination programme by vaccinating the Parliamentarians, Judges, and foreign diplomats.

Still, the medical experts, doctors, PHIs, medical staff, health workers and medical staff of the Tri-forces are in the fields, contributing by committing their service, time and energy selflessly for the betterment of the nation and praying to save the breaths of the people for a better tomorrow.


52 Infantry Division Gifted School Books on Army Day...

“I am looking forward to explore good stories related to the Army to enhance their moral” Says Veteran Movie Director ‘Chandran Ratnum’

Chandran Ratnum is the President and Chief Executive Officer of Asian Film Location Services Pvt Ltd and he was the Ex-Chairman of Lion Air as well as the Chairman of the Asian Aviation Centre (Pilot Training Academy) in Ratmalana. Also he has hosted numerous Hollywood Movies for their location shoots in Sri Lanka. World renown film director Steven Spielberg once referred to Chandran Ratnum as

“Our most valued friend in the far east”. The Film which was directed by Chandran Ratnum “Road from the Elephant Pass” was a finalist award winner at the New York International Television and Film Awards Festival which was held in the year 2011. Also the film “The Common Man” which directed by him won the Best Picture, Best Film Director and the Best Actor Awards in the Madrid Film

Festival and the bronze medal in the feature films category at the New York Festivals International Television and Film Awards. Chandran Ratnum started his career in the Movie Industry in early 1956 with the world famous Hollywood movie “The Bridge on the River Kwai.” which was shot in Sri Lanka. However the main intention of this interview with him is to give a summary to our readers about the untold stories and interesting incidents which happened on the movie set while filming the 'Bridge on the River Kwai'. It was further learnt that Chandran Ratnum has an intention to do movies in

future, about the the true stories of the Army which will enhance the moral of the security forces in Sri Lanka.

Question :- How did you get the opportunity to join the Film Crew of "Brigade on the River Kwai" which was shot in Sri Lanka in 1956 ?

Answer :- In early 1956, one of the friends of our family, a pioneer in the industry of tourism, Don Liyanage drove into our home and introduced my mother and myself a very good looking young man. He was a combination of Burt Lancaster and Richard Burton in their haydays. At that time our home was at Barons Court in Guilford Crescent. They were interested in renting our annex for 6 months. My mother showed no interest, but during the conversation I understood that he was a film maker. So I took my mother aside and persuaded her to rent the annex.

He moved in with his beautiful young girlfriend Doris. This young man was non other than Eddie Fowlie. He was the property master of a film about the World War II that was to be made in Ceylon based on a french novel by 'Pierre Boulle' titled "La Pont de la Rivier Kwai" (Bridge on the River Kwai). I was exited by the fact that a genuine international film maker was with us. I have been always fascinated with the movies and also highly motivated to be of service to my neighbours. However with these constant visits, Eddie and I develop a friendship which turned into a job on the film as a Prop Man. So we began to create props and turned an old bus with all the known and possibly unknown elements that may or may not be needed for the shoot. Anticipating the Directors requirements was the key to this exercise.

As we got closer to the start of shooting, I was asked whether I could move to Kithulgala, where


the bridge was being built as a daily employee, since I had no experience in the business. Of course I said I would. I was informed that I will get a weekly wage but would have to find my own accommodation. I was okay with that and found a mat in a small hut occupied by a lovely village couple with ten year old son. I was given a room and a mat to share with the boy. It would only take me ten minutes to the 'Movie Set' and that was fine by me. I studied the script and work harder to assist Eddie and his assistant Tom Early. They were two excellent professionals with a great deal of experience. The shooting of the "Bridge on the River Kwai" ran from October 1956 to May 1957. I worked with the film crew from the first day to the last.

Question :- Can you mention about any interesting incidents which happened on the movie set, while shooting of that film ?

Answer :- There are numerous interesting incidents that occur during the production of a film. Everything does not always go the way it is planned. The most conspicuous incident was the failure to blow up the bridge on its first attempt. This was due to, one of the five cameramen who were supposed to switch his camera on and then proceed to the safety of a dugout where he had to switch on a light that showed that he was safe. Well, this cameraman, in the excitement of the moment forgot to switch on. Therefore the command was not guaranteed that the cameraman was safe and therefore did not execute the blow up. The train came on to the bridge and proceeded to cross

the bridge and banged against a generator and toppled over. The situation was rectified and the bridge was blown up perfectly, as planned on the next day.

Question :- It's a fact that the movies like "Bridge on the River Kwai" were made based on the World War II. Simultaneously it's noticeable that several countries have a post war literature and they produce lots of movies based on it. But here in Sri Lanka it's unable to see that kind of a trend. So according to your opinion, what is the reason behind this ?

Answer :- I am sure that there are numerous interesting stories that took place during the war

but most of our filmmakers are interested in making movies of the sordid subjects of rape, poverty and controversies that are accommodated by the NGO's. Boodee Kirthisena made an interesting movie on the war.

Question :- Number of movie theaters in the country were shut down due to the current Covid 19 Pandemic. Accordingly nowadays most of the producers have negative aspects of spending money for a movie, because they think its an unprofitable business. So what are your views regarding this aspect ?

Answer :- Movie going is a habit that cannot easily be discarded.

Of course the pandemic has affected the attendance. However, the experience of going to the cinema with your family or your girlfriend will never fade away. The answer in my opinion is to privatise the cinema halls and liberalise the import of films and let the local films compete with the foreign films for attendance. That is the only way that the quality and the standard of our films would improve and face the world market as well. The film business is an industry. It must be treated as such. This is the only country in the world where the film industry is an utter failure. This must be rectified.

Question :- What is the responsibility of the National Film Corporation to enhance the Film Industry in Sri Lanka ? Are they doing it right now ?

Answer :- To answer your question directly. No! They are not doing it right and they have never done it right. Like I said, the film business is an industry and must be under the Ministry of Industries. The National Film Cooperation must be a Regulatory body only. Leave the business of making and exhibiting films to the stakeholders. There is a place for culture. There are ways of addressing that as well.

Question:- The youth, those who have skills in acting, does not have a proper and professional film School in Sri Lanka to develop their skills, what are your views about this ?

Answer :- Yes! That is a shame. I conducted classes with members of the film industry in Digana some years back. Unfortunately we were unable to continue.

However, I am planning to establish a Film school in Colombo in the very near future.

Question :- Also you have directed an Army related movie based on the famous novel " Road from the Elephant Pass " Do you have an idea of doing more films which are based on Army related scripts in future ?

Answer :- The war and the Army was only the backdrop for the human story of "The Road from

Elephant Pass". It was the story, so well written by Nihal de Silva that got me interested and excited enough to make a movie. If I find another good story that I like, I shall do it. Moreover I must mention that the Sri Lankan Army gave us their fullest cooperation and also assisted us with the explosives scenes when we were shooting our movie "Road from the Elephant Pass". However we are looking forward to exploring good stories relating to the Army's activities after

the war. Also I feel that a good subject to look into the Army's participation in the vaccination programme during the pandemic which is creditable. In fact I have already sent my commendation to the Commander of the Army personally.

Army Recruit Training School-Puttlam

Basic military training sets the tone of any Army and stabilises the norms that soldiers will follow throughout their career. The training is the first step in the process of learning what it means to be a soldier in an Army. The conversion from civilian life to military life will potentially be the most rewarding experience of a person's life. The consequence of becoming a soldier consists of evolving physically fit, self-confident, self-defence, devotion, dedication, receptive and able to tackle anything that comes his or her way. Identifying the tasks, conditions and standards derives training realism.

The Sri Lanka Army Recruit Training Centre located in Puttlam is such a prestigious training institution that produces skilful soldiers for the protectors of the Nation. This military establishment was recently boosted on the directions of the General Shavendra Silva WWV RWP RSP VSV USP ndc psc MPhil Chief of Defence Staff, Commander of the Army and Head of the National Operation Centre for Prevention of COVID-19 Outbreak (NOPCO) following the recommendations of the Directorate of Training enabling it to admit a large number of recruits at a time for training. At present with limited facilities available, the Army Recruit Training School-Puttlam has undertaken the training of two recruit courses with the capacity of six hundred recruits. Troops are being trained under two categories of basic recruits and professional recruit courses before being posted to

their units to expand their ability to command and to qualify them to achieve the goals of the organisation.

Victory in service is the ultimate objective of any military training as it is the key function of military service within the fields of community welfare and contingency alertness, disaster management, nation-building to deal with all types of emergencies to protect the motherland. The first consideration is the discipline and that too, of the highest order. Since the two courses have been scheduled for period of three and four months which has both day and night packages including physical exercises, drill, weapon training other field exercises and lecture sessions. The regular sessions of the day begin at dawn with physical exercises and it moves through the entire day until dusk.

DISCIPLINE

Disciplinary training should ensure that the soldier would nevertheless continue the execution by exercising his judgment and applying what he has been taught. Although theoretical instructions supply correct ideas and maintain interest and purpose which are not obtainable otherwise. Yet it cannot replace practical training. Therefore, once the drill has been learned with precision, every exercise irrespective of the size of the unit should require the shape of a manoeuvre against an imaginary outlined or represented enemy.

Getting training in the military is not an easy task. Certain fundamentals of training which they find essential and most important application in war should be ingrained in a soldier's mind as to be considered routine matter when the opportunity arises for their employment. All training should be directed toward producing self-reliant leaders. It is impossible to design fixed forms or to give specific instructions that will cover possible situations. Performance-oriented quality training emphasises performance and is paced with the soldier's needs. It always insists on preparation, presentation, practice and performance.

Since the enlistment day, they are entitled to get a handsome salary with many welfare facilities including uniforms, medical (including family members), loan facilities, recreational packages with hotel accommodations, foreign tours etc. In addition to that, they will be given foreign courses where some of them are allowed to work on United Nations peacekeeping programmes entitling them to get very attractive remuneration packages.

All members of the armed forces enter the profession at the ground level whether they are from any career they are thrust into an organisation whose culture is shaped by the demands of warfare and are significantly different from anything they have previously experienced. At the same time, they are confronted with a myriad of new tasks that they must learn to be valued members of the team. It is said that eternal vigilance must be backed by a striking power and foolproof system of defence which can be developed only through proper military training.
