

Stress, Work and Us

We experience interrelated and inter different phases throughout our life. The practices of absorbing those differences are distinctive from each other. As human beings, we are utilising those skills in day-to-day life to overcome different situations. In these different situations, we undergo threats and fear, which is also called stress.

Actually, what is this Stress?

According to the World Health Organization (WHO) "Stress can be defined as any type of change that causes physical, emotional or psychological strain." Further, they explained, "Stress is your body's response to anything that requires attention or action. Everyone experiences stress to some degree. The way you respond to stress, however, makes a big difference to your overall well-being"

What are the Signs of Stress?

The stress can be long-term or short-term. But it's more important to know long-term stress is risky for human life than short-term. There are many symptoms of stress. Among those many, some common factors can be highlighted as follows.

These symptoms are included physical, mental, and behavioural signs such as mood changes, clamping or sweating, lowered libido, sleeping problems, dining

problems, anxiety, grinding of teeth, headache, Diarrhoea, lowered energy, muscle pains in the neck and shoulders (especially), palpitations and Trembling, etc.

How can we identify Stress?

The recognition of stress is not an easy thing. Even though there are some tips to identify it with



the signs of the following factors.

Behavioral signs: Less time to Enjoy, decreased selfcare, dependence on smoking or alcohol

Emotional signs: Angry, Frustration, over thinking, sadness, etc.

Physical signs: high blood pressure, changes in heart palpitations, headaches, muscle pain, or weakened immune system.

Psychological signs: bad memory, feeling alone, anxiety, and trouble remembering

What are the Causes of Stress?

Many factors can cause stress in life. It may be relationships, education, work, money, recognition, attention, or many more things.

How do this Stress impact Work and us?

Work and stress have an inter-relationship in positive and negative nature. Hence work-related stress has much impact on our day-to-day lifestyles in different ways and means. It's essential to know what it means and its consequences. Especially here are described negative impacts and their effects on us.

Among several definitions of work-related stress, this definition "Work-related stress is the response people may have when presented with work demands and pressures that are not matched to their knowledge and abilities and which challenge their ability to cope, is elaborating a wide angle of it.



What are the Sources of Stress at Work?

Factors related to career: when it comes to these factors like weak physical health at work, overload of work, pressure in timings, and risk of physical danger arousing the work-related stress.

Responsibility: circumstances in the role during work, conflicts faced to fulfil the responsibilities, responsibility to own an organisation like many factors are also popping up during the work.

Development in career: situations like imminent promotion or demotion, lack of job security, etc.

Relationships: the way of having a relationship with superiors, under command subordinates, fear of delegating power, lack of trust in workforce type factors are automatically creating a stressful ground.

Culture and the Environment: The environments of the organisation, its policies, position, and its power of decision-making and acceptance also have much impact to emerge stress in a workplace.

At a time when a person feels stress, automatically the nature and nurture of a human being sign him or her to fight or flight (cope up or withdraw). If the person failed to manage the stress, it will lead to depression causing him damages in various ways. Also, it creates anxiety, complexity and fear within an individual.

It is not simple as we mentioned here, it always joins with the biological functioning of the human body. If anyone is always under stress the natural biological system will have much impact which is caused in the long term. Especially, during these situations is a need to identify and have better coping methods to overcome.

If not, bad health behaviours and long-term biological conflicts will create diastolic blood pressure, cholesterol concentration, depressive mood, job dissatisfaction, increased heart rate, diabetes, hair loss, hyperthyroidism, sexual dysfunction, tooth and gum disease, smoking habits, and more. Finally, it will end up with coronary heart disease or mental illnesses.

What are the types?

There are four types of stress.

The short-term stress which we experience is called acute stress. It may be positive or distressing experiences of the day-to-day life. Chronic stress explains, a steady sense of sensation pressured and overwhelmed over a long period. Episodic acute stress: at a time a person experiences acute stress regularly. If he or she has episodic acute stress, the individual may experience constant pressure or that things are not correct. It can be very tiring and affect one physically and mentally. Eustress: explains stress that has the impact of positive response. This is the opposite of distress. It includes any type of beneficial stress, even bodily or mental.

With above all, it's clear that stress is not harmful, but when it goes to extreme level a series of biopsychosocial issues are emerging.

How can we overcome this stress and work-related stress?

Some factors in lifestyle like engaging in physical exercises regularly (WHO suggests that adults engage in 75 to 150 minutes of physical activity throughout the week), getting a balanced diet (Diet has a strong correlation to stress levels and mental health), avoiding bad habits such as smoking, taking alcohol, getting good sleep (at least 6 hours), make time to relax, allocating a leisure time, practising of a deep breath, use of mindfulness techniques taking part in different hobbies, and brain exercises such as puzzle solving can reduce your stress even work-related stress.

Other than the above if you are having such symptoms you can talk to someone very close in life with much trust. Sometimes it may heal you by releasing the pressure which is kept inside for a long time.

Similarly, if you feel this stress is impacting dysfunction in your day-to-day life, mental and



or, danger to life, deviant or distressful it's highly required to go to a qualified mental health care partner. Then they will help you to get into normalcy via medicines and proper psychological treatments. Finally, we all need stress to live but it must be at a level out of danger. Extreme stress for a long term creates a series of issues in psychosocial phenomena. We should have mindfulness and always care for others when they need social support to overcome difficult situations. It will enhance communication, good relationships, empathy, and active listening among different parties to build a society with better coping and understanding of each other.




New GOC 61 Infantry Division met Public Official

Australia is dominating power in Pacific Island region which has its spear of influence among number of island nations. Defense white paper of Australia 2013 had identified the strategic importance of security and stability in these islands, climate changes and economic prosperity of these island nations. Australia has engaged actively in establishing regional peace among the pacific islands, which provided financial assistance, disaster mitigation support, training of police and military personnel and support to operationalised response on countering COVID-19 in these Pacific islands. Australia has been the largest development partner in the region has number of infrastructure projects in Papua New Guinea, Solomon Islands, Vanuatu and Fiji. There are number of substantial bilateral programmes with Saoma, Tonga, Kirbathi, Nauru and other Pacific Island countries.


Since 2006, China has gradually expanded its trade, diplomatic and commercial activities. More than 1.7 billion dollars of financial support has been granted to these Pacific islands during the period of year 2006-2017. Moreover, it has expended their influence to the Pacific Islands to take more advantage over trade activities, securing sea line of communications to ensure smooth flow of the trade and cargo while having more support at the United Nations General assembly to enhance more strategic Colonel Dammika Adhikari military partnership with these islands to obtain Colonel Media more advantage over South Pacific China sea issue. The recent security pact with Solomon Island raised concern of the United States of America, Australia and New Zealand. The Australian government fears that, Chinese ships would be permitted to dock on the Islands and Beijing could send troops to assist maintain social order.

This Chinese presence has challenged the United States of America long standing relationship with freely associated states (FAS) of Hawaii and territories of American Samoa, Guam, and the Northern Mariana Islands. The United States also maintains special relationships with three sovereign countries in the northern Pacific, the Federated States of Micronesia (FSM), the Republic of Palau, and the Republic of the Marshall Islands (RMI). These countries received limited financial, military and security assistance. Chinese activities will be curtailed the Pacific region due to this strategic partnership.

Joe biden has visionary policy on Pacific Islands. However, last five years, the United States of America had increased diplomatic ties with these island nations. In February Secretary of State Antony Blinken visited Fiji, the first such visit in three decades. In April, Assistant Secretary of State for East Asian and Pacific Affairs Daniel Kriten and National Security Council Indo-Pacific Coordinator Kurt Campbell traveled to Fiji, Papua New Guinea and Solomon Islands, In September of this year the White House hold first ever pacific nation leaders conference to address the growing presence of China in Pacific Island Nations and the United States ambitions. This summit had ended with positive note with an agreement to provide additional \$810 financial support of Pacific islands and \$130 to mitigate climate changes in the Pacific nations.

These developments had proved that how much world super powers are interested on the Pacific Island nations. In future there will be more competition in this region between the United States of America and its allies and China. China could have to face two fronts in near future and this would be future flash point as South China Sea.



THE SHORT HISTORY OF FIELD ARTILLERY

Artillery is a class of heavy military ranged weapons that launch munitions far beyond the range and power of infantry firearms. Early artillery development focused on the ability to breach defensive walls and fortifications during sieges, and led to heavy, fairly immobile siege engines. As technology improved, lighter, more mobile field artillery cannons developed for battlefield use.

Early Chinese artillery had vase-like shapes. This includes the "long-range awe-inspiring" cannon dated from 1350 and found in the 14th-century Ming Dynasty treatise Huolongjing. Mongols adopted the Chinese artillery and used it effectively in the great conquest. These small, crude weapons diffused into the Middle East and reached Europe in the 13th century, in a very limited manner. The artillery revolution in Europe

caught on during the Hundred Years' War in the 14th and 15th centuries and changed the way that battles were fought. By the end of the 14th century, the cannons used in battle were very small and not particularly powerful, cannons were only powerful enough to knock in roofs, and could not penetrate castle walls. The earliest medieval cannon, the pot-de-fer, had a bulbous, vase-like shape, and was used more for psychological effect than physical damage. As small smooth-bore barrels, these were initially cast in iron or bronze around a core. They fired lead, iron, or stone balls, and sometimes large arrows.

With the development of better metallurgy techniques, later cannons abandoned the vase shape of early artillery. This change can be seen in the 14th-century Chinese bronze "thousand ball thunder cannon", an early example of field

artillery. A major change in Europe occurred between 1420 and 1430, when artillery became much more powerful and could now batter strongholds and fortresses quite efficiently. These weapons became more common, initially as the bombard and later the cannon. Cannons were always muzzle-loaders. The cannons during this period were elongated, and the recipe for gunpowder was improved to make it three times as powerful as before. These changes led to the increased power in the artillery weapons of the time. Bombards were of value mainly in sieges. Bombards developed in Europe were massive smooth-bore weapons distinguished by their lack of a field carriage, immobility once emplaced, highly individual design, and noted unreliability.

The breech-loading swivel guns were developed surprisingly early, and were used from 1364 onward. It was equipped with a swivel for easy rotation and was loaded with mug-shaped chambers, in which gunpowder and projectile had been filled in advance. The chamber was then put in place, blocked with a wedge, and then fired. The guns had a disadvantage: they leaked and lost power around the chambers, but this was compensated by the high rate of fire as multiple chambers could be prepared in advance, and it could fire either cannonball against obstacles, or grapeshot against troops. Breech-loading swivel guns were developed by the Europeans also partly as a cheaper alternative to the very expensive bronze cast muzzle-loading cannons, as bronze was many times more expensive than iron. As cast iron was not yet technologically feasible for the Europeans, the only possibility was to use wrought iron bars hammered together and held with hoops like barrels, giving their name to the gun barrel.ss

The use of the word "canon" marks the introduction in the 15th century of a dedicated field carriage with axle, trail and animal-drawn limber—this produced mobile field artillery that could move and support an army in action. The reduction in the size of the barrel was due to improvements in both iron technology and gunpowder manufacture, while the development of trunnions—projections at the side of the cannon as an integral part of the cast—allowed the barrel to be fixed to a more movable base and made raising or lowering the barrel much easier. Better gunpowder, cast-iron projectiles instead of stone, and the standardisation of calibres meant that even relatively light cannons could be

deadly. Despite the increased maneuverability, however, cannon was still the slowest component of the army. The first land-based mobile weapon is usually credited to Jan Žižka, who deployed his oxen-hauled cannons during the Hussite Wars of Bohemia between 1418–1424. With the rise of musketry in the 16th century, cannons were largely displaced from the battlefield—the cannons were too slow and cumbersome to be used and too easily lost to a rapid enemy advance. Around 1500, Europeans learnt how to cast iron, and shifted their cannon productions to one-piece iron muzzle-loaders.

Gustavus Adolphus of Sweden emphasised the use of light cannons and mobility in his army, and created new formations and tactics that revolutionised artillery in the 1620s. He discontinued using all 12-pounder—or heavier—cannons as field artillery, preferring, instead, to use cannons that could be manned by only a few men. 4-pounder and 9-pounder cannons could be operated by three men and pulled by only two horses. Each cannon was named for the weight of its projectiles, giving the variants such as 4, 9, and 12, indicating the weight in pounds. Also, his army was the first to use a special cartridge that contained both powders and shot in a simple fabric bag, which sped up loading, and therefore




increased the rate of fire, but unexcelled bag fragments were an additional fouling in the gun barrel and a new tool—a worm—was introduced to remove them. Additionally, he pioneered the use of canister shot against infantry, which was essentially a can filled with musket balls. Gustavus Adolphus increased the number of cannons in his army so dramatically, that there were six cannons



instead of one for each thousand infantry. Around this time also came the idea of aiming the cannon to hit a target. Gunners controlled the range of their cannons by measuring the angle of elevation, using a "gunner's quadrant". As cannons did not have sights, aiming was still largely guesswork even with measuring tools.

Benjamin Robins put artillery on a scientific basis in 1742. Bronze was preferred for cannons because it was lighter than iron and more durable. At that time, cannons were cast hollow around a core and the core often moved within the mould, producing an imperfect bore. This problem was solved by Jean Maritz in 1747 when he began casting guns as a single, solid block, and then drilling the bore on a large machine. Now, a cannon could be manufactured with a better-aligned bore and tighter tolerances. This resulted in less windage - the gap between the cannonball and the bore which meant less gas pressure escaped so that smaller gunpowder charges could hurl the projectile farther and more accurately. When less gunpowder could be used to achieve the same power and range, the cannon barrels could be made thinner, shorter, and lighter. Lieutenant General Jean Baptiste Vaquette de Gribeauval introduced the standardisation of cannon design



in 1765. He developed a field howitzer whose gun barrel, carriage assembly and ammunition specifications were made uniform for all French cannons. The standardised interchangeable parts of these cannons made their mass production and repair much easier.

A British industrialist William Armstrong was awarded a contract by the government to design a new artillery gun. Production started in 1855 and the outcome was the revolutionary rifled breechloading Armstrong Gun, which marked the birth of modern artillery. Although rifling had been tried on small arms since the 15th century, the necessary machinery to accurately rifle artillery was not available until the mid-19th century. Also, earlier attempts at breech-loading mechanisms had been made since medieval times, the essential engineering problem was that the mechanism could not withstand the explosive charge. It was only with the advances in metallurgy and precision engineering capabilities during the Industrial Revolution that Armstrong was able to construct a viable solution. What made the gun really revolutionary lay in the technique of the construction of the gun barrel that allowed it to withstand much more powerful explosive forces. Another innovative feature was essentially a squeeze bore; the bore at the muzzle end was of a slightly smaller diameter, which centered the shell before it left the barrel. The cast iron shell of the Armstrong gun was similar in shape to a Minié ball and which engaged with the gun's rifling grooves to impart spin to the shell. This spin, together with the elimination of windage as a result of the tight fit, enabled the gun to achieve greater range and accuracy than existing smooth-bore muzzleloaders with a smaller powder charge. The gun was mounted on a carriage in such a way as to return the gun to firing position after the recoil.

The QF 1 pounder, universally known as the pompom due to the sound of its discharge, was a 37 mm British auto-cannon, the first of its type in the world. Hiram Maxim originally designed the pompom in the late 1880s as an enlarged version of the Maxim machine gun. Its longer range necessitated exploding projectiles to judge range, which in turn dictated a shell weight of at least 400 grams, as that was the lightest exploding shell allowed under the Saint Petersburg Declaration of 1868 and reaffirmed in the Hague Convention of 1899. The pom-pom fired 1 pound (0.45 kg) gunpowder-filled explosive shells at a rate of over 200 rounds a minute.

Indirect fire was the defining characteristic of 20th-century artillery, whereby the firing equipment is aimed without seeing the target through its sights, and led to changes in the amount of artillery, its tactics, organisation, and techniques, most of which occurred during World War I. The lining-plane sight was invented in Germany and provided a means of indirect laying in azimuth, complementing the clinometers for indirect laying in elevation which already existed. In the early 1900s, Goertz in Germany developed an optical sight for azimuth laying. It quickly replaced the lining-plane.

The first cannon to contain all 'modern' features is generally considered to be the French 75 of 1897. The gun used cased ammunition, was breechloading, had modern sights, and a self-contained firing mechanism. It was the first field gun to include a hydro-pneumatic recoil mechanism, which kept the gun's trail and wheels perfectly still during the firing sequence. Since it did not need to be re-aimed after each shot, the crew could fire as soon as the barrel returned to its resting position.

In typical use, the French 75 could deliver fifteen rounds per minute on its target, either shrapnel or melinite high-explosive, up to about 8,500 m away. Its firing rate could even reach close to 30 rounds per minute, albeit only for a very short time and with a highly experienced crew. These were rates that contemporary bolt action rifles could not match.

The World War II sparked new developments in cannon technology. Among them were sabot rounds, hollow-charge projectiles, and proximity fuses, all of which increased the effectiveness of cannon against a specific target. Anti-tank sabot rounds were invented in France, but the creator of the concept fled to Britain due to the invasion. Britain subsequently led the development of sabot ammunition during the war, introducing sabot projectiles to the British 57 mm QF 6-pounder and 76.2 mm QF 17-pounder guns, among others. British military researchers conceived the idea of a proximity fuse in the early stages of the war, and the tests were then carried out with rockets. However, British scientists were uncertain whether a fuse could be developed for anti-aircraft shells,

which had to withstand much higher accelerations than rockets. They shared a wide range of possible ideas for designing a fuse with the United States in late 1940, and successful tests were carried out in 1942. The proximity fuse emerged on the battlefields of Europe in late December 1944.

Nevertheless, by the late 1970s precision-guided munitions started to appear, notably the US 155 mm Copperhead and it's Soviet 152 mm Krasnopol equivalent that had success in Indian service. These relied on laser designation to 'illuminate' the target that the shell homed onto. However, in the early 21st century, the Global Positioning System (GPS) enabled relatively cheap and accurate guidance for shells and missiles, notably the US 155 mm Excalibur. The introduction of these led to a new issue, the need for very accurate three-dimensional target coordinates—the mensuration process.



9 Gemunu Watch

HMKI Meghawarna was born in Yahinna village as the only boy child to Businessman Mr. Hewawasam Goluwa Marakkalage Kithsiri Meghawarna and Mrs. Gammuluge Ariyalatha Silva on 9 December 1984. The baby boy was named Hewawasam Goluwa Marakkalage Kasun Ishara Meghawarna.

The young days of Kasun Ishara Meghawarna spent with his elder sister Heshani Eranga. With the completion of the age 6, Meghawarna admitted to the Kahawatta Central College on 10 January 1989.

He was a decent child in the school being an example to the other school mates during his days in school. His teachers and school principal identified him as an individual with the capacity of leadership and appointed him as the school prefect. His achievements were exhibited in various scopes including sports.

Young student Meghawarna registered in 8th Battalion as a school Cadet in 2002 and participated in National Cadet Evaluation Camp, Rantambe in 2003 as a Corporal representing his school.

Having the strong feeling towards the country, young Meghawarna decided to join the Sri Lanka Army soon after the termination of school.

Accordingly, Meghawarna joined the Sri Lanka Army on 3 January 2005 as an Officer Cadet. He completed his preliminary military training under Officer Cadet Course No. 62 at Sri Lanka Military Academy.

During his Cadet period he excelled in Drills and Firing and commissioned as a a Second Lieutenant on 22 December 2007. His earnest enthusiasm towards his profession highlighted during many occasions in military life.

Second Lieutenant Meghawarna enlisted to Gemunu Watch which marches forward under "Tarry not Forward" and attached to Gemunu Watch Regimental Centre, Kuruwita and became a member of 9 Gemunu Watch on 31 July 2008. Apart from the Cadet Course, he completed Special Operation Course in Infantry mastering his skills.

Soon after the completion of the course, Second Lieutenant Meghawarna sent to assist the operations in Vellamkulam-Pudukudirippu under North Humanitarian Operation.

The troops marched forward under the leadership of Second Lieutenant Meghawarna with the firm determination to eliminate the enemy. Sri Lanka Army awarded Second Lieutenant Meghawarna Rana Sura Padakkama (RSP) due to his excellent leadership to capture the enemy forward defence line in Iranamadu on 8 February 2009.

Afterwards, Second Lieutenant Meghawarna adorned Purna Bhoomi Padakkama, North East Operation Medal and Wanni Humanitarian Medals in appreciation of his leadership.

The battle in Pudukuduirippu took its fearsome level with the dawn of second week March in 2009. The troops had face to face battle and defeated the enemy hidden in the Pudukuduirippu area.

The valorous troops of 9 Gemunu Watch thereby rendered a dedicative service during the battle. It was 2 March 2009. Second Lieutenant Meghawarna as the leader of the team C marched forward together his team destroying the enemy bunker line.

The troops of Gemunu Watch marched amid the enemy fire of MPMG, LMG, RPG Rocket attacks, and artillery. The Gemunu Watch team headed by Lieutenant Meghawarna freed the area from the enemy enchancing the morale of the comrades, personally rescuing the causalities.

The battle to capture the bunker line prevailed more than three hours. Lieutenant Meghawarna led the battle with proper coordination with his comrades.

Bravely encountering the enemy fire Lieutenant Meghawarna voluntarily jumped into the enemy bunker line motivating his troops and turned the advantage of the ground into his teams favour.

At the time, group of hidden terrorists appeared suddenly with MPMG, LMG, RPG and Motar However, Lieutenant Meghawarna and his team did not let the rescued land to fall in the enemy hands.

However, Lieutenant Meghawarna severely injured during the





battle. he did not prefer to leave his team alone whether he was injured. He deiced to stay in the battleground with his team exhibiting the genuine qualities of a warrior.

Due to the severe injuries Lieutenant Meghawarna died in the battle ground. In appreciation of his service he was promoted to the rank of Captain.

Recalling the memories of Lieutenant Meghawarna, Commading Officer at the time appreciated the incredible talent of Lieutenant Meghawarna to achieve the target with 60 mm Motor. On 04 February 2012, Lieutenant Meghawarna was posthumously awarded Parama the Vibhushanaya for his individual acts of gallantry and conspicuous bravery of the most exceptional order in the face of the enemy performed voluntarily whilst on active service with no regard to the risk of his own life thereby safeguarding the lives of his comrades.

Also, parents of Captain Meghawarna was awarded Uththama Pooja (Medal of Honour for Supreme Sacrifice).
