
#### Sri Lanka National Guard Seva Vanitha Branch

Lalith Jayasinghe was born at Bambaragala in Dikwella to Mr J A Jayasinghe and Mrs D G Sumanawathie. He had a younger brother and a younger sister. Young Jayasinghe entered to President's School in Awissawella in 1982 for studies. When he was gradually aging, he began to exhibit his hidden talents in various fields not only in the field of education but also in the sports and art. He scored the highest marks in every extracurricular activity defeating the other candidates

of the school. Also, he had illustrated his leadership skills in various aspects. He was famous for the Cricket and Rugby as a skilled player and scored several victories in the field of sports including zonal and provincial levels. Therefore, he was a n outstanding student of any event including essay writing, singing competitions, drama and public speaking contests.

Meanwhile, he got through the GCE (O/L) examination with flying colours giving him the access to the Lumbini College in Colombo. He was among the genius students of the school. Following his footsteps, his brother was also student at Thurston School in Colombo. Lalith Jayasinghe's younger sister meanwhile excelled in all areas when she was studying in Lumbini Girl's School in Colombo. Proving his excellence in academia, Lalith Jayasinghe passed GCE (A/L) examination earning best results. But he worried of the country's future as a member of younger generation. However, his desire was temporally withold with his age for some time. When the right time came gradually, he let his parents to know of his desired wish.

Parents were not interested to send their elder son to the Sri Lanka Army. Therefore, they encouraged him for higher studies. But the courageous and determined young Lalith begged his parents asking assistance to support his dream. However, due to the continuous urge of their son, beloved parents had permitted him to follow his dream.

Young Lalith Jayasinghe entered to the Military Academy in Diyatalawa on 21 January 1997. Due to the academic excellence he was fortunate to win a rare opportunity to complete his Cadet Course at National Defence College in Bangladesh. On 20 May 1997, young Lalith Jayasinghe bade farewell to Sri Lanka and left to Bangladesh.

With the successful completion of the foreign Cadet Course in Bangladesh, he returned to Sri Lanka on o6 June 1998. His beloved parents were also attended to witness the passing-out parade held at the Sri Lanka Military Academy and that made his parents very proud. Young Lalith Jayasinghe was commissioned as Second Lieutenant by the highest authority of the state-His Excellency the President during the event. Soon after the commissioning, he received an opportunity to select the desired Regiment or Unit. Accordingly, Second Lieutenant Lalith Jayasinge selected the Gemunu Watch and started his military career. However, in the meantime there had been a selection test for Sri Lanka Army Special Force and Second Lieutenant Lalith Jayasinge was selected for the regiment. As a result he was sent to complete the Special Force Training Course No. 24.

Special Force Training was one of the hardest courses that he had ever completed. But the course was never a hinder for the determined personality. He faced all the invisible challenges with the persistence and patient. Second Lieutenant Lalith Jayasinge completed his training with 11 Officers and 1000 Other Ranks. With the completion of the training he joined the "M" Squadron and initiated his career as a member of Special Force. His skills then guided him to join the Long Range Patrol Course No. 6. With the intention to complete the course he entered to Special Force Training at Maduruoya and successfully completed his training from 10 July -16 November 2000. He excelled the course with the merit pass opening the gate to the Special Force Long Range Patrols conducted by Special Forces.

The Long Range Patrols had rendered a commendable service to eliminate the enemy from the terrain. The random small group operations had surprised the enemy unexpectedly. Due to the versatility, he was able to participate in Agnikeela, Kinihiraya Operations led by the Sri Lanka Army at the time. However, the series of terror attacks had made a clear threat to the Sri Lanka Army. It was important to identify the strategy of the enemy at the time. This difficult task was undertaken by the brave warrior.

The brave team got ready for the operation. They started the journey from Kalmadu area. Their target was a route of terrorist leader located away from 60 Km in Akkairayankulam—the heart of the terrorist's dominance. This was often known as the "One way wicket" due to the risk of the operation.

The target of the Lieutenant Lalith Jayasinghe's team was Thangemaran, a second-in -command

of the LTTE Sea Tigers. At the time, Lieutenant Lalith Jayasinghe's team was ready placing the explosives with the intention to threaten the enemy. The plan worked well. A short while later, the team heard a loud explosion signifying the success of their plan. However, after difficult 18 days Lieutenant Jayasinghe's team reached to their camp with cheer in the face.

The next target of Lieutenant Lalith Jayasinghe's team was Waikasalingam Sothalingam - head Lieutenant Lalith of the LTTE Air Brigade. Jayasinghe's team planned an access strategically to hunt the target spending 20 days awake. A team of 6 members started their operation from forward defence in Athawatunu Wewa, Welioya. The team reached Pudukudirippu main road passing a long way. During the walk, Lieutenant Lalith Jayasinghe realised it was a route used by the terrorists. Knowing the advantage of the situation, he planned an immediate attack targeting the terrorist leader. But his target did not appear. At the meantime, the vehicle parade passing the route was caught their attention. Within few minutes the vehicle parade was destroyed giving no chance marking the success of the operational plan. This incident shook the internal operations of the enemy.

The military leadership thenafter decided to form a special squadron, for the long range patrols. Accordingly, 3 Special Forces members were appointed under command to Captain Lalith Jayasinghe. The team was able to do a considerable damage to the enemy. The ambush attacks were able to reap desirable results within short period of time. At the meantime, Captain Lalith Jayasinghe was able to lead another attack targeting the enemies located in Oddusudan- Mankulam road. They reached to the place passing 45 Km. Also, they hid in the A34 road which was leading to Mankulam from Oddusuan and waited till their target appears. Marking the success of the second stage, the enemy vehicle was blasted darkening the whole area.

As a result of organising successful attacks against the enemy, Captain Lalith Jayasinghe was able to win the confidence of his team due to his iconic personality features such as strategic approach, friendliness, attire, addressing style and the experiences gained as matured Officer. This helped him to design and execute the plans, with the support of the fellow members. The team members had a deep trust that their leader would never let to fall the members into the enemy hands. Captain Lalith Jayasinghe was able to win the firm trust of his members and with the confidence, the team penetrated into the thick woods over 20 days as they planned their operation through Mahakudachchiya and reached to Oddusudan-Nedunkarni within 04 days.

Until 8 days passed, the team was not able to capture the target of their operation. Returning with the empty handed was not the way of Captain Lalith Jayasinghe. Therefore, the team decided to

wait few more hours. At 1340hrs a black coloured vehicle splashed before them. The order was issued for the operation by the leader. The target was successfully achieved making their day.

The young leader's outstanding capacity to complete the given task was highlighted with the sucessful completion operation. The enemy attempted to identify the leadership of this master mind but the careful arrangement and enclosed procedures had never leaked the information to a third party. The maturity of the members of the Special Forces was a foundation for the reason. Meantime, the enemy had planned to arrange a week to celebrate their success. It was 20 November 2008. At the time the enemy had declared a week to exhibit the success stories in their mission of achieving self-rule state. While they were planning their success stories the troops also penetrated secretly in to the Oddusudan enemy ground. Major Jayasinghe was very active in night than the day time as he knew it was the best time to achieve his target.

The team had rations for 08 days. But the explosives, water, and the weight of the belongings were not fairly light. At the time the weather was also hindering the operation to be executed. It was the period of the year where the North was enjoying the rainy season. Major Jayasinghe turned this to his opportunity. The Mankulam-Oddusudn road was the main supply route for the enemy and therefore, it was the target of the Major Lalith Jayasinghe.

At the time Major Jayasinghe and his team was inspecting the region together with his ambush team and reached to their target observing the enemy treat. It took nearly o6 days to complete the task. The team was much silent and was able to prevent the enemy observation successfully. Every operation that Major Lalith Jayasinghe had launched usually achieved the desired target due to this quality that he followed. The random breeze relived the tiredness of Major Lalith Jayashinge's team at the dark hour. However, their skillful strategies had saved them always. After taking some challenging time, they reached to the destination. The most challengeable thing was not attacking the enemy but the withdrawal. Also, the team had known that the enemy would definitely be shocked after the attack. The enemy would attempt to find the Special Force members who installing check point at every junction.

Also, he had known that the enemies would definitely order the innocent civilians to gather the information on the troops and report to them. This was not an unprecedented experience for a versatile military Officer. Also as a determined Officer he would not return without completing the task. However, the random rain had not strength to weaken his plan. However, the bad weather caused him flue. Meanwhile, Major Lalith Jayasinghe's leg ulcers gratudally developing damaging tissue. But he was determined on his mission. He never shared these difficulties thinking that it would



discourage the persistence of his team. The team was actively attempting to reach the target, he realised that the team was in the right path. That gave him a solace.

The day reached slowly. However, this unusual steadiness of the nature doubted Major Lalith Jayasinghe as any other day. He saw his target gradually moving through the bush. Then he witnessed that his team was hardly working. He felt instantly that he was in the accurate team to achieve his target. After few minutes, the team heard a sudden sound of a blast. Staff Sergeant had operated the remote control destroying the enemies. Taking the situational advantage Major

Lalith Jayasinghe's team was able to destroy few leaders of the enemy. This left a doubt for the enemy leaders.

The terrorists who saved their lives were searching the remaining soldiers. Knowing the threat reaching towards the team, Major Lalith Jayasinghe immediately reached to a safe location. But, his journey was delayed to walk with the wounded leg. At the time, the team realised that enemy was chasing them behind. Lieutenant Sameera Herath was the right hand of Major Lalith Jayasinghe. However, at the time as the leader of the team, Major Lalith Jayasinghe had instructed the team that they all had to move faster as the enemy was chasing them behind. However, a team of 50 terrorists had surrounded the team. After a short while, enemy bullets reached them like a rain. At the point, Lalith Jayasnghe's team realised, that there is no alternative other than fighting. Also, the battle was difficult without the assistance of support troops or weapons. It was the members of Special Forces who had vowed to fight until the last breath. At the time, the enemy was fighting with 5 Special Force members. Team Leader Major Lalith Jayasinghe had forgotten his wound at this point as he was so enthusiastically involved in the mission. Major Lalith Jayasinghe stepped in as a leader with the wounded leg to guard his members from the terrorists. The terrorist couldn't not defeat the 7 heroic members of the Special Forces team at that time even they used their maximum.

The war versatility of the team members was able to control the enemy forwarding in. Taking the advantage of the situation, Major Lalith Jayasinghe's team had run for safe house amid the enemy attacks. However, the attack of the enemy troops in reserve escalated abruptly. The, unexpected bullet wounded the leg of Major Lalith Jayasinghe. He fell on the ground. At the time, Major Lalith Jayasinghe ordered Lieutenant Sameera to withdraw the team. But Lieutenant Sameera had no intention to do.



Meanwhile with the broken leg and pain he fired at the enemy and ordered Second Lieutenant Sameera Herath to withdraw immediately. Following the order of his leader, Second Lieutenant Sameera Herath covered his team members and insisted to dress the bleeding wound. Splashing a friendly smile at the beloved young Officer, Major Lalith Jayasinghe continued the firing while safeguarding all the members of his team as an ideal leader. But few bullets released from the enemy injured the warrior.

Firing stopped and the team gradually began

to withdraw with the wounded soldiers. The injuries of Major Lalith Jayasinghe were fatal and eventually caused him death. Carrying the corpse of Major Lalith Jayasinghe, the team walked nearly 40 Km untill they meet the forward defence line and handed over it to the camp with the assistance of the air defence.

Due to the meticulous service that he had rendered at the long range patrols, irrespective to the desire for the life, Major J A L Jayasinghe awarded Parama Weera Vibhushanaya for individual acts of gallantry and conspicuous bravery of the most exceptional order in the face of the enemy performed voluntarily whilst on active service with the objective of safeguarding lives of his comrades or facilitating the operational aim of his force. Accordingly, Parama Weera Vibhushanaya was awarded to his beloved wife Mrs. Kaushalya Rodrigo by His Excellency the President Mahinda Rajapaksa on 15 July 2013.

## SRI LANKA MILITARY ACADEMY DIYATALAWA

Military Academy Diyatalawa; the only premier training establishment of the Sri Lanka Army which produces leaders of character, inspired for careers as commissioned Officers of the Army and a lifetime of service to the nation. The establishment first came into military prominence when the British Government installed a camp for Boer prisoners of the war in the early part of the 20th century. Thereafter, Diyatalawa garrison served as an infirmary for the Royal Navy's East-Indies station and a Military training station mainly confined to the training of Other Ranks for the Volunteer units.

At present, the academy conducts several types of military training courses; Bachelor's Degree in Military Studies (Regular Long Course – 3 years) is affiliated with the University of Sabaragamuwa, shorter courses for Volunteer Intakes (09 months), Lady Intakes, Direct Enlisted Officers Basic Military training Course, Military Training for Kotalawala Defence University Cadets to train Officer Cadets from their enlistments to commissioning.

Throughout their cadet period, the cadets complete

many military subjects which are comprised of regular lectures, physical training, field exercises and research work. Among them, Field craft, Map Reading, Tactics, Conventional Operations, International Security Operations, Counter-Insurgency Operations, Signal Communication Training, Field Engineering and Mine Warfare, Service Writing, Leadership, Military Law, Regimental Accounts, Administration in the Field, Peace Time Administration, Professional Military Training, Physical Training, Drill and Weapon training are some of the main subjects they attend.

Not only these Officer cadets complete military subjects they learn several academic subjects such as English, Tamil, French, Information Technology, Political Science, Geography, Economics, Sociology, Mathematics, Statistics, Military History, Human



Resource Management, International Relations, Psychology and Counselling and Research methods.

Further, they complete some compulsory major field exercises during their training period. Among them, Exercise "Frozen Trout" conducts to educate them on conventional war-fighting techniques. This exercise conducts in the general area of Ambewela. It is a week-long exercise which includes planning and sending recce/fighting patrols to gather intelligence, laying ambushes, launching and repulsing of counter-attacks under extreme weather conditions.

Another such major field exercise is the exercise 'Scorpion' which practices the Officer cadets to expose for roadblocks, VIP protection, CIMIC, Crowd Dispersal and Cordon, search operations etc. Additionally, the annual Inter-company Combat Firing Meet at the Field Firing range in Fox Hill, Boxing Meet, Academy day celebrations, Annual Sports meet, Certificate Awarding Ceremony, Annual Equestrian Festival, Swimming Meet, Games Night, Fox Hill Super-cross, Inter Company Basketball competition are being conducted during this strenuous training.

Significantly, it may also be caused when the ventilation is poor. The poor indoor air quality, many enclosed spaces, irrelevant wooden and building textures are some of the reasons that caused you sick building syndrome.

### Causes of SBS

The symptoms of the SBS are particularly cannot be identified exactly but there are possible causes that may hint you that you are developing SBS.

- high levels of dust
- tobacco smoke
- > rooms with poor lighting
- outdated computer displays that cause eye strain
- the presence of mold or fungus
- formaldehyde (mostly found in wood furniture and floors)
- asbestos
- chemicals in the air from cleaning products
- buildings with poor ventilation, such as schools, offices, and public spaces
- pesticides
- carbon monoxide
- ozone from the use of printers and fax machines
- high levels of stress at school or work
- low workplace morale
- heat or low humidity
- noisy work environments
- insect or animal droppings

However, sick building syndrome symptoms may affect the skin, respiratory, and neurological systems of your body. Here are the possible symptoms as it is difficult to understand exactly the symptoms of sick building syndrome. If you have allergies or a current respiratory illness, you may notice an increased severity in your symptoms.

- throat irritation
- breathing difficulties
- tightness in the chest
- runny nose
- allergy-like symptoms, such as sneezing
- burning sensations in the nose
- dry, itchy skin rashes
- headaches
- dizziness
- difficulty concentrating
- forgetfulness
- fatigue
- irritability
- nausea
- body aches
- fever
- chills



### How SBS to be treated

SBS is primarily treated by alleviating symptoms while reducing your exposure to the causes of these symptoms. Allergy medications can help to alleviate itchy eyes, nose, and skin. Also, some steps to treat SBS can also be taken by employers or employees:

- Use cleaning products with low fumes and no fragrances.
- Vacuum regularly to remove dust.
- Change out air filters every couple of months (or more, if necessary).
- Find the right humidity (recommends an optimal humidity level of 40% to 70%.







- Get a test for possible indoor mold or fungus.
- Update computer monitors and other display systems.
- Change lights as needed.
- Consider investing in LED or blue lights for less energy output.

If you may not be able to tell if an indoor space has poor air quality factors that can make you feel sick, you be able to take the following preventive measures.

> Taking regular breaks outside of the

building by eating lunch outdoors, for example

- > Opening your windows to get some fresh air, if possible (you may want to avoid this during high levels of outdoor pollen)
- Giving your eyes a break by looking away from your computer
- Standing at your desk or walking around your office
- Use caution with any indoor chemicals, such as bleach and insecticides

Army contributed to this in 1st dose, 2nd dose, and 1st booster, 2nd booster, 3rd booster respectively, for the betterment of the country's general public and to control the situation by decreasing infections, expansions and deaths.

Since the COVID- 19 has different variations, Ministry of Health experts in epidemiology and other senior medical experts in the country have



Vihara Mahadevi Park Colombo, Army Hospital Narahenpita, Army Hospital, Panagoda and 6th Corps of Engineers Service in Maley street are providing service in Colombo district, and 61 Infantry Division field hospital in Bossa-Galle, Army Hospital Diyatalawa-Badulla, Military Hospital-Anuradapura,62 Infantry Division Headquarters-Galkulama, Army Base Hospital Kilinochchi, Army Base Hospital, Mullaitivu, 4 Medical Corps-Jaffna, Army Hospital Palaly, 22 Division in Trincomalee, Army Base Hospital in Minneriya and 24 Infantry Division headquarters in Ampara are now providing 4th Dose (2nd booster) to the public. Similarly, 1st dose of Pfizer, 2nd Dose of Pfizer and 3rd Dose of Pfizer also can get from the Army vaccination centre in Vihara Mahadevi Park in Colombo. General Public can access these

vaccination centres with their national identity or similar document with a vaccination card to have this service without delay.

All of these vaccination centres are conducted by the Army Directorate of Preventive Medicine and Mental Health under the direction of Lieutenant General HLVM Liyanage RWP RSP ndu Commander of the Army together with Director-General Army Health Services and Director of Army Preventive Medicine and Mental Health as Protectors of the Nation.



Udayakantha Warnasuriya is a director par excellence of some of the most popular Sri Lankan Sinhala films which became box office hits such as Randiya Dahara, Rajya Sevaya Pinisai, Gini Avi Saha Gini Keli, Asai Man Piyabanna, Paya Enna Hiru Se, Hiri Poda Wessa, Yakada Pihatu, Ran Kevita, Bahu Baarya, Rosa Wasanthe, Diya Yata Gindara, Challengers and etc. Also, he is one of the renowned successful directors related to the Sinhala Cinema Industry. However, with the intention of discussing about the feature film "Ran Diya Dahara" which based

on a story script of an Army Officer that he had directed, we did a press interview with him for the benefit of our readers of the "Ranaviruwa" Magazine. This exclusive feature article was written based on the facts which he has given during the press interview with him.

#### Question : -

Aftermath of the World War II, it was observed that number of movies were produced based on the true stories and incidents which occurred during the period of the War. But when compare this situation to Sri Lanka, we also had a humanitarian operation during the ethnic conflict which prolonged nearly 3 decades and simultaneously apart from very few movies, we couldn't see that sufficient numbers of movies has being produced based on true events which happened during that era, so as a veteran film director, how do you describe the situation?

#### Answer: -

Actually I too accept that though there were many movies were being produced after the World War II, there aren't sufficient number of movies which were produced based on the humanitarian operation during the ethnic conflict in Sri Lanka. However, what I noticed is that, there are some reasons behind this. Also, while considering the facts and figures, we could clearly see that the ethnic conflict which was in Sri Lanka was occurred between two groups of the country. Thus it's obvious that both parties inclusive of Tamil community and Sinhalese majority are citizens of Sri Lanka. If I'm going to further elaborate, this could be also considered as a conflict which occurred between two groups of the same country. Therefore, if we are going to produce a movie based on such a situation, definitely we have to face social and righteous issues. Unlike a face to face war, when you are going to make a movie based on such circumstance it is rather sensitive as it is a part of lives of the community in Sri Lanka. Also, when we do a film, then again we have to face the issues related to censoring (Examine officially and suppress unacceptable scenes from the movie) Therefore, it's a great challenge for a film maker to produce a movie related to the war. Also, another biggest challenge for a film director is to find a good producer who can bear up the entire budget of the whole production of the movie. As we all know that there isn't a big market for us in the International Market, we are in a feeling of an uncertainty that we could recover the basic cost of the production that we have spent initially while making the movie. So according to my point of view, these issues could be the reason that there are only few number of war related movies being produced based on the humanitarian operation during the ethnic conflict in Sri Lanka.

#### Question : -

We know that you have produced number of films which became most popular and box office hits while lifting your name as a successful movie maker in the Commercial Film Trade in Sri Lanka. Also, you are the director of the movie "Ran Diya Dahara" which produced based on a story script which written about an Army Officer in Sri Lanka

Army. So what made you to direct a movie based on such story script?

#### Answer: -

Well, I must mention that the movie "Ran Diya Dahara" was one of the films of my movie making career which I had collected lots of memorable and enjoyable experiences. Also, this movie was made based on some of the true incidents which occurred during the ethnic war in Sri Lanka. However, whether the movie "Randiyadahara" has story which related to Sri Lanka Army, I don't consider that it is a film which has a direct influence or which further elaborate on the Eelam War and also it doesn't have any sort of a connection between the Basic Falk and intellectuality flow of Sri Lanka. But the story script of the movie was created in a sympathetic manner on an Army Officer who was brutally tortured and undergone lots of inhuman harassments after he was captured alive by LTTE Carders. The particular character of the Army Officer was played by the veteran film actor Kamal Addararachchi. Also, the film is basically about a woman who is scrambled with lots of financial issues. She tries to overcome her financial burdens through very risky and inappropriate ways and the film is inclusive of thriller scenes as well. The story script of the film is revealing the bitter reality of the society. The characters of the Movie "Ran Diva Dahara" was played by the most popular and veteran actors and actresses such as Kamal Addaraarachchi, Geetha Kumarasinghe, Tony Ranasinghe, Jackson Anthony, Mahendra Perera, Sanath Gunathilaka, Henri Jayasena, Anula Karunaratne, Buddhika Jayaratne, Udula Dabare, and Milton Jayawardena. The artists inclusive of Jackson Anthony,



Mahendra Perera and Geetha Kumarasinghe won several awards in several film festivals for their contribution towards their characters of the movie "Ran Diya Dahara"

The movie "Ran Diya Dahara' was screened in 19 December 2004 and soon after one week, Sri Lanka was affected by the 'Tsunami' tragedy and also we couldn't screen the film in movie theaters due to this unexpected circumstance. Therefore, I inclusive of the producer of the movie had to bear up the heavy financial loss on the movie. Due to these reasons, film patrons loose the opportunity of watching the movie. But I still consider that the movie "Ran Diya Dahara" is a turning point in my cinematic career. However, the movie "Ran Diya Dahara" became an interesting topic and appreciated by most of the Sri Lankan film critics.

#### Question : -

It is also observed that the most of the film makers in Sri Lanka are producing very limited numbers of movies which based on a story script written on humanitarian operation in Sri Lanka. Also, if they are going to produce a movie, it is noticeable that the story script of the particular movie was written generating a negative impact and tarnishing the image on Sri Lankan Tri Forces. So as a veteran Film maker in the commercial trade, how do you describe the situation?

#### Answer : -

Actually, it's a fact that I too accept that there were only few number of movies were being produced based on the ethnic war in Sri Lanka. Also, among those films too, most of them criticise that there aren't any classic movies for their viewing pleasure. Having an Army for the security of the country can be considered as human and also a social requirement. However, in such situations, it's up to the director of the movie that in which concept and intention that he is going to direct it. Also, as a director of the movie, if he loose the sense of the Basic Falk Intellectuality Flow, there can be possibilities that he could be unsuccessful as a film maker. Personally I too do not have any intention of making movies which would affect its financial interests. However, I too have a dream of making a good movie based on the ethnic war which went nearly for three decades in Sri Lanka. But according to the prevailing financial crisis in the country, I cannot forecast and I'm also having a doubt of that I will be able to make my dream come true of making such a big budgeted movie based on the war in Sri Lanka.

#### Question : -

The Hollywood movies such as 'Commando, Rambo, The Delta Force, Air Force One, An Officer and a Gentleman, Police Academy, Tour of Duty are always boosting the image of the forces in United States of America. Also, to do such kind of movies, the film makers given the entire freedom and the relevant support by the relevant authorities

inclusive of using the helicopters, Air Crafts, Tanks, Submarines, War Ships and sometimes additional troops to use as extra artists by the government of the United States of America.

#### Answer : -

As you mention, not only in America, But I can see the same situation in India as well. But they too, are producing such kind of big budgeted movies in a manner in accordance with the basic Falk intellectuality flow of their countries. Otherwise the movie is going to be an utter failure. Once we see the film, we can observe strictly boosted characters in such Hollywood films. If you take the story script of the movie 'Rambo' as an example, though he is a soldier, it's about a thriller story of an ex-soldier who engaged in a struggle after he was humiliated as a result of side effects of the war. Also, when we try to make such big budgeted movies, the support that we are getting from the government side is not in the satisfactory level. Further, according to the prevailing rules and regulations of the government, most of the times we find really hard and have to undergo lots of difficulties at the time when we try to get a revolver or a pistol for a shooting scene of a movie. Regarding this issue, I too personally had number of experiences. What I believe is that such movies should be made to enhance the image and prestige of the Army as well as its soldiers those who sacrificed their precious lives behalf their motherland. Another good example is the war hero "Hasalaka Gamini" who sacrificed his life after blowing the bulldozer belongs to LTTE by tossing two grenades. So as movie makers, if we can get the support of the government and the necessary equipment's of Tri forces, we could do a great movie from the story of 'Hasalaka Gamini". However, to make this dream in to reality, we need to have good story script writers as well.

#### Question : -

According to your point of view, what sort of facilities could be granted by the government or the relevant authorities to the film makers to enhance the image of our war heroes and also the prestige of Tri Forces?

#### Answer : -

Actually, the government or the relevant authorities should give their maximum support to anyone that if he is going to make a movie based on a story related to the war or the humanitarian operation in Sri Lanka which will enhance the image of the tri forces. But unfortunately, as I mentioned earlier, it's very hard and sometimes gets long duration for us to get a firearm from the relevant authorities even for a shooting scene of a movie. So, for the convenience of the movie makers, there should be a certain method of getting the necessary support and the permission related to the relevant equipment inclusive of firearms, magazines, uniforms, Army vehicles,

Tanks, air crafts and helicopters in a convenient manner. Specifically, I must mention that the most important fact is that, the film maker should have the opportunity of creating his film in a freely manner. Why I am telling you this is that, there is already a process in progress in order to get necessary war equipment's with the assistance of the troops of Tri Forces after getting the approval for the film script from the relevant authorities of the government.

#### Question : -

As a veteran film maker, how do you define the service which rendered by the members of Sri Lanka Armed Forces during the conflict with the LTTE which nearly went almost three decades?

#### Answer: -

Actually, I must mention that the half of my life inclusive of my youth was spent with the unpleasant incidents of the ethnic war in Sri Lanka. Also, the Sri Lankan Community had to suffer a lot and stayed with lot of pressure with the fear of death due to the inhuman activities of LTTE terrorists in that era. Another thing that what I believe is that, the Sri Lankan minority hadn't that sort of big issues with the majority of Sinhalese community. Also, there could be minor issues, but the majority of Sinhalese community does not have any intention of penalising or

hurting the Tamil community those who live in Sri Lanka. Therefore, according to my point of view, what I can clearly see is that this is an issue, which created by the LTTE and the Tamil Diaspora to fulfill their requirements. Also, I would like to express my gratitude towards the members in Tri Forces for the service that they rendered during the humanitarian operation in Sri Lanka.

#### Question : -

Finally, would you like to tell us something about the films that you are going to direct in near future?


#### Answer: -


