

Green Agriculture Steering Committee of the Army on Food Security Established



The Sri Lanka Army launched another gigantic project establishing its Green Agriculture Steering Committee (GASC) on 16 June 2022 in order to supplement and promote the island's food security programme by cultivating more than 1500 acres of barren or abandoned state lands across the country.

Also, the agricultural project is scheduled to be initiated covering all island under the supervision of Lieutenant General H L V M Liyanage RWP RSP ndu Commander of the Army and Major General C D Weerasooriya RWP PSP ndu Deputy Chief of Staff.

The management of the Green Agriculture Steering Committee of the Army is comprised of Major General S U M N Manage WWV RWP RSP psc Director General General Staff, Major General R A D P Ranawaka RWP RSP USP ndc Quarter Master General, Major General W B S M Abeysekara RSP USP Director General Financial Management, Major General S P A I M B Samarakoon Hdmc Lsc Army Logistics Commander, Major General M K Jayawardena RSP USP ndu Chief Field Engineer, and Director Operations, Director Media, Director Electrical and Mechanical Engineers, Director Agriculture & Livestock, Director Research Concept & Doctrine. The entire project is supervised by Major General T J Kodithuwakku RWP RSP ndu Chief of Staff.

At the inaugural session, Lieutenant General H L V M Liyanage RWP RSP ndu Commander of the Army briefed the new committee on the scope of the national endeavour and how the Army could join hands with the agricultural sector to reach national goals and multiply food production process through immediate



cultivation of unattended lands to avert any shortage of food varieties in future.

As the first phase, island-wide Army troops would prepare ground soil in those state lands by weeding, tilling and preparing beds for cultivation of selected seed varieties in consultation with agricultural experts, agrarian officers and knowledgeable officers in the Army Directorate of Agriculture and Livestock which is already maintaining 16 Army-managed farms and 6 Battalions across the country.

In addition, all Security Force Headquarters and field formations around the country are currently screening possibilities of adding their weight to the task at regional level and exploring the ability of using unattended state lands and paddy fields for the same purpose as Protectors of the Nation.

Act of Heroism Exhibited at **Nilaveli**

Mr H A Anila Kumara and Mrs W A Karuna were blessed with a son on 20 November 1980. They named the child "Hettiarachchilage Nilantha Kumara". Nobody Knows that the destiny of Nilantha Kumara was already written by birth. He was able to win the love and care of the family as he was the youngest of the family.

Young Nilantha was admitted to Giribawa Central College. He excelled not only in studies but also in extra-curricular activities including sports such as volleyball, and cricket. His certificates proved his multitalented personality. He was able to uplift the fame of his school with this talent. With

the completion of primary education, he joined Ihalagama Piriwena for higher studies under the guidance of experienced monks. His school life came to an end with his appearance to the GCE (O/L) examination.

Soon after the examination, Nilantha came to his father's friend seeking a job to support his family. He had strong motivation to find a good walk of life that could help him to run his family without being a burden to the family. In the meantime, he had an idea to join the Sri Lanka Army as he was driven by a strong bond with the country. He asked permission from his family to join the Sri Lanka Army so; they allowed him to join the Sri Lanka Army.

With the blessings of the parents, he appeared for the interview which was held at the Ganemulla Commando Regiment Headquarters on 21 July 1999, and joined the Sri Lanka Army as a recruit, and completed the preliminary military training at Commando Regiment at Kudaoya. Soon after the completion of the training, he returned home and spent his vacation with the family.

With the termination of the vacation, he returned to the camp with many hopes and firm determination as he knew that he had to undertake a laborious task. Meanwhile, he successfully initiated the Commando Selection Course No. 49, on 31 January 2001 and successfully completed it on 09 March 2001. His difference could be observed when he returned home after finishing the training.

Soon after he returned to the camp and entered the Commando Advance Course No. 30 and was among the few warriors who had successfully completed the course on 17 October 2001. He was lucky enough to wear the maroon beret taking the oath of regular commando under Direct Enlisted Course No 18. He started his initial duty at Nelumwewa, Weli Oya under the A Group.

Kalmadu was the second duty area of Commando Nilantha and while he was on duty he successfully completed the Airmobile Course on 18 October 2003 and rejoined on 08 November 2003. He was with all the commando qualities including discipline, and will, and therefore, he was named as "Gora" among his comrades.

At the meantime, Gora was fallen in love with a girl from the next village and she was "Vadiga Arachchilage Malkanthi". Soon the couple entered wedlock amidst the blessings



of the parents of the families. At the time he had completed his 5th year of service in the military.

He completed the Non-Commissioned Leadership Training Course which was held from 31 May 2004 to 9 July 2004. This period was unforgettable in the life of the warrior, as he was promoted to the rank of Lance Corporal with new responsibilities.

This made him qualified as a member of the Long Range Petrol Team of the Commando Regiment. The required training was initiated on 26 April 2006 and terminated on 26 October 2006. After the training, Gora was included into the Z group of Commando Regiment.

At the time, Mrs Malkanthi, beloved wife of Gora was dreaming of the most beautiful day of her life. She was blessed with a child soon after her marriage and the news made Gora happier and the couple named their child as "Kalpani Chamodya Parami".

At the time, the Humanitarian operation was launched and following the order issued by the Pillamulla Army Camp, Gora and his team were engaged in reconnaissance patrols. Narakamulla, Thoppigala, Sampur, Mawilaru, Verugal aru areas were dominated by the enemies and at that time the Gora's team was deployed in countering them.

The incredible support that the Gora's team extended was praiseworthy for the Sri Lanka Air Force. At the Narakamulla area, Gora and his team had bravely gone before the enemy I and my daughter miss my husband, But I feel that he is with us. I do not repent of his decision he had taken on that day?

and destroyed them giving the right targets for the friendly forces. When he was reaching "Thoppigala", Gora said to his team that this time they would not return without leaving the Commando and Sri Lankan Flag at Thoppigala. Lance Corporal Nilantha Kumara had earned Rana Sura Padakkama (RSP), Purna Bhumi Padakkama and North and East Operation Medals as a result of his bravery exhibited in Thoppigala, Sampur, Narakamulla, Thopur, Mavilaru areas.

At the time, Sri Lanka Army has escaped the Eastern area and Wilpattu from the enemy and limited the enemy to a small area in Wanni. Meanwhile, the enemies had a plan to mislead the attention of the Sri Lanka Forces. With the aim of changing the direction of the Sri Lanka Army troops, the enemies conducted a number of activities, and killing the innocent civilians living in Uva, Southern and Eastern areas was their plan.

Under these circumstances, maintaining the law and order was a laborious task. Finding these small enemy groups was utter difficult and therefore, Lance Corporal Nilantha and his team were once deployed for the task.

After a difficult journey, the group reached the enemy camp in Nilaveli. The team observed the enemy and identified that the camp was having a large number of enemies but the only weapon that they use was MPMG weapon. However, destroying the enemy camp was the most important motive of the team. As they were planning, the enemy started to fire at the team with Gora using the MPMG weapon. The team of Gora also led the counter-attack taking the ground advantage into them. The enemy counter fire also seemed no stop but escalating. Due to the enemy fire, the branches of the nearby trees fell down. The team of Gora realised that they cannot move ahead in this situation. So, Gora decided to get close to the enemy fire spots secretly.

At the time, the enemy was firing at the Gora's team like rain. Gora had one intention that was to save his team and make the mission success. 
The heroic warrior was awarded the Parama

Flashback After 13 Years From From Elimination of Terrorism

"The Soldier is the Army. No army is better than its soldiers. The Soldier is also a citizen. The highest obligation and privilege of citizenship is bearing arms for one's country."

General George S Patton

Heroes are everywhere in the world. But, of course, all have specifications over their performances with commitments. But this is not an attempt to write about all heroes described by A-Z. Instead, it's about the War Heroes who sacrificed their lives for the motherland.

Thirteen years ago, this motherland also suffered from ruthless terrorism. It took thousands of innocent human lives as a cost and casualties of thousands and millions worth of properties. However, on a sunny day of our Sri Lankan history (19 May 2009), the evil terrorism was eradicated by the troops and the bloodshed was

stopped. Heroic War Heroes of the Army (23,962), Navy (1160), Air Force (443), together with 2598 Policemen and 456 Civil Security Department personnel, altogether a total of 28,619 were made the supreme sacrifice in the battle against the terrorism during these humanitarian acts.

That was not an easy task for them. Army troops fought in adverse weather conditions with their military tactics. Ultimately all commitments and the contributions of the soldiers were succeeded earning the victory. Even today, we can have flashbacks of heroic landmarks of their journey.

Now it is almost 13 Years after the humanitarian operation. The 5 R concept (Rehabilitation, Reconstruction, Reintegration, Resettlement and Reconciliation) is most streamlined in all communities to uplift the living standards of all Sri Lankans.

Today, Sri Lanka Army, as the most significant disciplined human resource in the country, is working under the theme of 'Protectors of the Nation", for the various concepts other than protecting sovereignty and territorial integrity of the motherland.

As brave sons and daughters of the motherland Army recently successfully faced the battle of COVID-19 in different assignments under the leadership of General Shavendra Silva WWV RWP RSP VSV USP ndc psc MPhil Chief of Defence Staff and Commander of the Army at the time and as the Head of the National Operation Centre for Prevention of COVID -19 Outbreak.

Quarantine Centres The Army joined hands in constructing Quarantine Centres (QCs) at the preliminary pandemic stage, and the widespread that service was extended to the constructions around the country, building and facilitating those QCs with free meals, medicine, WiFi, and mindfulness programmes. In addition, the troops' special attention and caring gave priority to the differently-abled inmates and infants.

Corps consists of a Signals Brigade and other eleven units located island-wide.

The history of the Signal Corps unfolds with the outbreak of hostilities of World War II, the entire Signal Company was mobilised and sent to Trincomalee keeping very small detachment in Colombo to provide a wireless link. After years, the Signal Company was expanded rapidly to meet the growing communication demands. With the increasing demands of the Army, the need for more elaborate communication systems becamevery obvious. Therefore, in 1958 the 1st Signal Regiment C.S.C. was formed and late Lieutenant Colonel D V Brohier was appointed as the first Commanding Officer. The Regiment consisted of two squadrons as operational squadron and communications and HQ Squadron. The Regiment was located in the Army Cantonment at Panagoda.

In the early stages, radio communication took precedence over line communication and the old wartime sets were replaced by the C II and

specialised communication vehicles such as the Thames Martin Harper fitted for radio, were used extensively. In keeping with this trend, more flexible radio communication systems using radio sets with greater technical efficiency such as the SSB Transceivers were used.

The endless support and commitment provided by the Signalers has been essential to the whole Army today. Their dedication on behalf of the motherland came into reality again with the outbreak of COVID-19 in Sri Lanka. The Army troops in collaboration with other sister services and health professionals have been engaged in a remarkably challenging task of netting, screening, transporting, quarantining individuals etc during the pandemic. 




5. Add Dairy Products

Answer: - Yes, that was my first job and I joined the Army in 1958 (During that era, it was called "Ceylon Army" before the constitution of 1972) as a soldier when I was 18 years old. I was recruited to the 2nd Sri Lanka Sinha Regiment (Volunteer). However, at the time of the interview for the enlistment, I was dubious that whether I would be selected, because I am short in height than the required height of the enlistment to the Army at the time. Fortunately, I was a good sportsman as well as a good Boxer and Cadet in the Cadet Platoon of my School. Though I was short in height, the Officers who were at the interview board considered my extra activities as well as my qualifications in sports. Therefore, I was lucky enough to be selected to the Army at that time. However, after the recruitments, all of us were sent to the Army


Camp in Diyatalawa for the basic training. After a tough training period, I was selected as the Best Marksman (Best Shooter) of the Batch. Also, during my career in Ceylon Army, I did my job to the level best and therefore I got the opportunity to serve in many places of the country inclusive of Jaffna Peninsula. Also, I had the opportunity to serve under the senior Officers such as then Colonel Denzil Kobbekaduwa and then Brigadier Paanabokke. After having lots of expeience in the military life, I was promoted to the rank of Lance Corporal. Also after completing six years of active service in the Army, I resigned, because I got an opportunity to enter into the Sinhala Cinema with the movie "Hanthane Kathawa". Also I must say that all my achievements of the Sinhala Cinema inclusive of film awards were made possible due to the training and guidance which I obtained from the Ceylon Army. Army is a place where a person can get developed in his career and personality.

Question: - It is observed that during a certain era, you were among the most popular actors of Sinhala Cinema and then you vanished. But after many more years, you suddenly popped out with the movie 'Diya Yata Gindara' which was directed by Veteran Film Director Udayakantha Warnasooriya. Why is the long delay for you to get into the field again?


Answer: - To be frank, "I must say that I am not the one and only person who had to face this situation. The veteran cinematographers inclusive Dharmasena Pathiraja, Dr Lester James Peiris and one of the most influential persons in the field such as Dr Gamini Fonseka, also faced the same circumstances. Also, comparing to the other actors in the globe, the Sri Lankan Artists are certainly not in a position to do their job in a professional manner because if they do it, it's certain that they have to face financial problems due to lack of films or tele dramas for them to work full time. Therefore, most of the actors and actresses had to

do another job or to engage in another business as a side income while continuing their acting career. So at the time when I was completely thrown off from the movie industry, the Veteran Film Director Udayakantha Warnasooriya showed me a film script and offered me a good character in it. As I received the film script to my hands, I realised that it was a good plot and I could do the justice for the character which reserved for me in it. So I gave the green light to him and I was delighted to act in the movie with other actors and actresses inclusive of Tony Ranasinghe, Sanath Gunathilaka, and Achala Alas.







Question: - Can you tell us about the early days of your film career?

Answer: - To say frankly, at the time I started my film career, I didn't act for the passion of it. Also, I am a person who had gone through lots of difficulties and hard times and suffered a lot during the early stages of my life. So I grabbed every opportunity that I got. Instead of acting, I was a person who always engaged in a big life struggle to cover my daily expenses inclusive of food and lodging. There were times even I didn't have a single square meal some days. So I had to dig out some of the cassava's (Manniocs) in my garden and ate after boiling it. However, during this hard time of my life, Mr Dharmasena Pathiraja, who was a good friend and also a schoolmate of mine, came to meet me one day and told me that he was about to direct a film and there were few characters in it which may suit me and asked me to come for a screen test if I was interested. The screen test was scheduled at the Jubilee Post in Colombo at that time. Accordingly, I went for the screen test of the movie and those who had come for the screen test got selected inclusive of myself, Kumaranathunga, Viiava well as Swarna Mallawaarachhi, who became very talented and extra ordinary artists after their film debut. So that was the very first moment that I met Vijava Kumaranathunga in my life. The name of the Movie was 'Hanthane Kathawa'.

Question: - How was the relationship between you and

Vijaya Kumaranathunga?

Answer: - As I told you earlier, I met him for the first time in my life at the time of the screen test of the movie 'Hanthane Kathawa'. However, I can still remember that nearly 500 applicants were there for the screen test and Vijaya Kumaratunga, finally, Swarna Mallawarachchi, Shobani Amarasinghe and myself were selected for the characters in the movie. Also, from the very first day, Vijaya became very friendly with me and that friendship was a life-long friendship between him and me till the unexpected and sudden assassination by two gunmen in 1988. So that's how all of us were entered into the field of Sinhala Cinema. At the early stages of our film debut, we didn't have that much of money as the payments for our characters. Therefore, myself and Vijaya decided to run a small business to earn a part time income. So our plan was to buy bailed items such as denim trousers, T Shirts and Shirts from the bazzar at Colombo Fort and sell them at a profitable price in the areas such as Kandy and Katugasthota. As Vijaya Kumaratunga was so attractive and young those days, most of the teenagers and especially young girls easily became our customers. However, I gave Vijava five rupees a day (That was a fair amount of money comparing to that time) for helping me for the business. So when I gave him 5 Rupees per day, sometimes Vijaya asked another coin of one rupee from me for him to have a bottle of Gin from the bar. There were some

days that both of us had a simple meal such as some Paratas with wadei and plain tea and slept on the benches of the Fort railway station after being so exhausted by being in to several places in Colombo Fort while looking for bailed items to purchase.

Question: - As an artist par excellence, how do you compare and what do you think about the film industry in Sri Lanka now?

Answer: - I would say that I am very much worried about the present situation of the Film Industry in Sri Lanka and its completely in a mess. Also I must say that when Mr D B Nihalsinghe was the Chairman of the National Film Corporation of Sri Lanka when the Sinhala Cinema was in its climax. The movies which were produced in that era were in excellent condition.

Also the film patrons which were almost 7 million in the year 1982, were unfortunately decreased up to 4 million in 1989. What I observed is that the Cinema Hall owners too are responsible for the present crisis of the movie industry up to a certain percentage.

Also instead of some of the movie theaters in Colombo, all other movie halls which are existing in remote areas are not in good condition and the patrons do not have a suitable environment to enjoy a film with the members of their families. Some of the cunning film directors those who are having contacts with politicians were able to get loans in billions for movie productions

through the National Film Corporation and most of them used that money in a fraudulent manner. Instead of making films, some of them have built their personal houses by using these loans. So if these things are happening in this manner, do you think that the film industry of this country woud still remain?

Also, the people those who are wealthy and have enough money don't come and watch Sinhala movies in a Cinema hall in Sri Lanka. During our era too, the Sinhala movies were watched and cheered by those who aren't rich and innocent people.

Even we too are in a certain position as actors today because of them. We should admit that when everything is going to be decided on the amount of money, making of films also becomes a sort of a business. That's the reason most of these film producers and movie directors

are on a policy of earning of more money without thinking about the quality of the film. So what I think is this situation has to be changed now. However, I'm glad to see that some of the veteran directors inclusive of Chandran Ratnam, Udayakantha Warnasooriya, Jackson Anthony, Jayantha Chandrasiri, Sanjaya Nirmal are seriously considering the quality of the film which they are going to produce rather than the financial outcome of the product. So I think it's a fortunate of the entire Sinhala Cinema that this kind of good film makers do still exist in Sri Lanka.


Question: - It is observed that most of the actors and actresses of the modern generation in Sri Lanka seem to be involved in the Mega type Tele Dramas which have an Indian influence, also we can see some of the most veteran artists are among them, so what do you feel about this?

Answer: - Actually, I don't want to criticise and I do not want to mention the names of the above mentioned artists. Also it's a question for me that, why these veteran artists also get involved themselves with this kind of Mega Tele Dramas which possess an Indian influence.

Also, by involving in this type of Mega Tele Dramas which do not have any quality at all, gradually they will blunt their skills.

However, thinking about this in a different angle, well, I don't think that anyone can blame them because as there aren't any quality films being produced in the country for them to work and as there is no other alternative for them, as professional artists, they have to be on their own and they also have to take the very first opportunity to cover their day- today expenses.

Awarding Ceremony of Insignias Held Successfully at Army Training School, Maduruoya


