



The formal culmination of the week-long State Vesak Festival at completely renovated ancient Kuragala cave temple complex, known as Kuragala Rajamaha Viharaya took place on 21 and 22 May 2022 in the presence of a gathering of Buddhist monks and devotees.

Lasting Adventure Exhibited at Adappan

Kalabatuwawe Gedara Mahinda Rajapaksa was born on June 1989 to Kalabatuwawe Gedara Bhodidasa and Rajapaksa Gedara Siriyawathi Varadangolla Village, Hasalaka in Mahiyangane. Little Mahinda had an elder brother called K G Upali Rajapaksa at the time and soon after he was able to enjoy company of younger brother with the birth of new member to the family named K G Sisira Kumara.

Young Mahinda Rajapaksa entered Mahiyangana to Central College for the studies. During the schooling period he stayed at his grandmother's place in Udawatta village as he preferred to go to school from there than his home. He was a brilliant student for both studies and extracurricular activities including sports. Due to this enthusiasm towards studies and extracurricular, he received the appreciation from school teachers and others.

At the meantime his elder brother K G Upali Rajapaksa ordained into the monkhood as Varadangolle Vimalananda Thero at Maha Aswedduma Sri Sambhoodhi Jayanthi Maha Viharaya in Hasalaka leaving the family responsibility of the first child on the shoulders of Mahinda Rajapaksa.

Time gradually passed by

bringing number of hardships to the Mahinda Rajapaksa family without prior notice. The sudden loss of the father hit the family as a thunderbolt leaving many challenges for the family including the grievances and sorrows. The role that young Mahinda Rajapaksa so far played as elder brother shifted to the family chief with enormous responsibilities ahead.

Due to the number of economic hardships, young Mahinda Rajapaksa decided to put an end to the school life before the mother's strong objection. With the termination of the school life, he willingly shouldered the family burden to his shoulder and worked hard to fulfill them as a dutiful son.

At the time, the country was hampered by the terrorism that was spreading every corner of the country taking number of lives of innocents. Many brave warriors had sacrificed their valuable lives in the sake of the country's sovereignty and its territorial integrity. Young and bold Mahinda was inspired by the greatest heroism exhibited by the soldiers in the battlefield. The giant Gamini Kularatne's statue standing with pride at the entrance of his village had inspired him unlike no other to join the Sri Lanka Army.

Corporal Gamini Kularatne's

statue inspired him to join the Sri Lanka Army at his blooming youth. He told himself "yes I will join Sri Lanka Army as soon I complete my 18 years and will bring the pride to my country one day". But he was very careful to keep this as a secret from his family and grandmother. He knew that when they got to know, that they will not allow him to do that. But he was genius enough to obtain his mother's blessings convincing her as soon he reached 18 years old making his lifetime dream a reality. The heroic son joined Sri Lanka Army on 04 November 2007 as a

He completed his preliminary military training from Sri Lanka Army Service Corps Training School, Thisawewa. Soon after the completion of the preliminary training he joined 12 Infantry Battalion, Sri Lanka Sinha Regiment which was the same Regiment of his hero Corporal Gamini Kularatne. He earnestly believed that joining 12 Infantry Battalion was a mere privilege to him.

At the time 12 Infantry Battalion, Sri Lanka Sinha Regiment was deployed at Vishwamadu, Kilinochchi and was engaged in the mission of eliminating the terrorism from the area of achieving number victories against the terrorists. 572 Infantry Brigade under command to 57 Infantry Division paid immense contribution for this Humanitarian Operation. Due to the victories that achieved by the small groups, Sri Lanka Army trusted on small group operations being away from the traditional combat tactics.

All the units in the defence line were small groups and they were set to achieve their targets. Accordingly 12 Infantry Battalion of Sri Lanka Sinha Regiment deployed their small groups in the identified places in Adappan area. Lance Corporal Mahinda was included in a such small group at the time and popular among his peers as a warrior.

Making 16 October 2008 a decisive day, 12 Infantry Battalion of Sri Lanka Sinha Regiment received a special order from Higher Headquarters to acquire the terrorists' trenches in Vishwamadu area. The Higher Headquarters had selected Lance Corporal Mahinda's team to achieve the target.

The operation launched as planned but it was not easy as they planned. Before the escalating enemy fire Corporal Mahinda's team had to withdraw from the area strategically. This sudden unexpected withdrawal had brought a shame for Corporal Mahinda and resultantly he was determined for the forward rather a withdrawal. He even suggested his comrade to jump into the enemy trench.

The leader of Lance Corporal Mahinda's team had realised the feelings of young spirit and he explained that too much heroism could bring sometimes the defeat and therefore strategic withdrawal is not an issue as it supports to achieve the task. But this leader was pleased with the courage of young Lance Corporal Mahinda and he whispered himself that "If I had 10 of this kind, the whole Battalion was safe".

The sun rose on 22 December 2008 with the good news to Lance Corporal Mahinda. The permission was granted to launch an operation to acquire the bunker line. The team reached the bunker line with the firm determination to achieve what they had destined for. But the team had to face unexpected fire from the bunkers when they reached close to the bunkers.

Nothing is clumsy than lying on the ground before the enemy fire. Lance Corporal Mahinda realised there is no use of lying on the ground like a coward so he encouraged his peers to battle against the enemy. At the same time Lance Corporal Mahinda led a RPG attack without the acknowledgement of any other of the team suddenly taking the ground advantage into his favour surprising his team members. He then jumped into the enemy bunker within few seconds like a sharp arrow and killed 4 enemies while feeding bombs to RPG and destroyed 2 enemy bunkers successfully.


He was encouraged with the success he achieved. Leaving the empty RPG weapon he walked to the remaining bunker with the grenade shouting "Let's finish the last one". It was the hour of unexpected and a dead silence spread over the territory. Breaking the silence suddenly enemy bullet hit Lance Corporal Mahinda falling him ground and the others witnessed this hour of the misery and immediately crawled to Lance Corporal Mahinda.

Making everyone's prayers answered, the Hero rose again like a phoenix surprising his friends to complete the unfinished task. But his comrades hardly took him away from the incident. Smiling to his comrades who were preventing

him moving forward, the injured Lance Corporal Mahinda said, "My battle is done, make my statue and place it near the Hasalaka Gamini's statue". They were the last words that the War Hero Lance Corporal Mahinda said to his comrades ending his heroic chapter in Adappan.

The lifeless body of the warrior was buried on 25 December 2008 at 1700hrs at Thorapitiya Cemetery following the military formalities. Lance Corporal Mahinda Rajapaksha was not married when he was deceased and the family and his relatives built an entrance at Sri Sambudda Jayanthi Maha Viharaya in Hasalaka in remembrance of his incomparable gallantry



**End Note

Corporal Gamini Kularatne, popularly known as 'Hasalaka Gamini' was a brave War Hero who made the supreme sacrifice during the Elephant Pass battle. Corporal Gamini Kularatne was posthumously awarded the highest decoration a soldier could earn, the Parama Weera Vibhushana (PWV) Medal after he sacrificed his life in his attempt to stop an explosive laden LTTE armoured bulldozer which attempted to blow up the Elephant Pass camp on 14 July 1991. The young soldier braving stiff enemy fire lobbed a grenade inside the advancing vehicle and died on his effort effectively stopping its advance. The memorial to Hasalaka War Hero was later set up at Elephant Pass with the remnants of the bulldozer he helped to destroy.

Even though the Army consisted of several professional military training establishments to groom military Officers, the requirement for a National Defence College was a long term requirement since then. 
Sri Lankan military Officers benefit greatly from foreign courses every year. They receive opportunities at world-class military training establishments such as the Indian Military Academy, United States Military Academy, Bangladesh Military Academy, Royal Military Academy in the United Kingdom et cetera. But a large number of Officers are deprived of this opportunity as they enroll a very limited number of Officers. The establishment of the National Defence College therefore greatly benefits senior military Officers

who will receive the same exposure in their own country. Senior military Officers who follow high-level Defence and Strategic courses at the National Defence College will get the opportunity to assume senior command positions in the Armed Forces in the future.

The National Defence College was established as the sole institute that promotes strategic thinking for the senior Officers of the tri-service, police and public service to provide holistic knowledge, developing highly qualified strategic decision-makers in the realm of National Security, Statecraft, Diplomacy and Public Policy to ensure the national development of Sri Lanka. Major General (Rtd) Amal Karunasekara was appointed as the first Commandant of the National Defence College – Colombo.





Moreover, the curriculum for the new degree programmes was resourced by the University of Colombo, General Sir John Kotelawala Defence University, Australian Defence Training School, Defence Schools of United States of America and Pakistan. The absence of higher-level national security and strategic educational establishment in Sri Lanka has created a significant intellectual gap in developing strategic leaders in the realm of national security, statecraft and effective decision making. Sri Lanka has opted to look out for foreign educational establishments to obtain strategic education opportunities to develop selected strategic military and senior public officials to meet the organisational demand of the respective institutions. However, the limited opportunities available for the higher-level defence and strategic courses have considerably deprived many potential senior Officers in the Armed Forces. Therefore, the National Defence College is the best place to give rise to all officials at the highest level to study National Security which creates a joint environment with civil-military cooperation.

To develop future policymakers on national security and strategic studies the National Defence College degrees will aim to create strategic thinkers in the realm of national security, statecraft, diplomacy and public policy to uphold national interest. This is a critical requirement for Sri Lanka to address the issues, which cannot be obtained by sending senior Officers to foreign National Defence Colleges. Therefore, it is a necessity to furnish the best possible higher level of politico-military strategic exposure and degree programmes in line with subjects related to International Security, Strategy, Statecraft, Research Methodology, Geopolitics and Strategy, National Security and Policy, et cetera which would influence to reach global context over different aspects.

The National Defence College was established as the sole institute that promotes strategic thinking for the senior Officers of the tri-service, police and public service to provide holistic knowledge, developing highly qualified strategic decision-makers in the realm of National Security, Statecraft, Diplomacy and Public Policy to ensure the national development of Sri Lanka. Major General (Rtd) Amal Karunasekara was appointed as the first Commandant of the National Defence College - Colombo.

An ex-LTTE combatant in Chunnakam living in a temporary shelter with his sister (parents have passed away) spent a poverty stricken life and has faced many difficulties in life. Recalling the Army Commander's words and his fatherly care towards them during the donation programme, he requested assistance to have a permanent shelter for them. Considering the said request prompt action was taken by the direction of the Commander of the Army. It was the 22 August 2007. I boarded on an Emirates air craft heading for Dubai. Next to my seat in the economy class was Major Sanjeewa from Vijayabahu Infantry Regiment. We were contemporaries at Sri Lanka Military Academy 19 years ago. Both of us were fortunate enough to have the rare opportunity to serve as military observers in UN mission in DR Congo. From Dubai, we were to travel in a Kenyan Airways flight to Kinshasa, the capital of DR Congo via Nairobi. This day was special to me as it was my birth day. Though I missed my family on this special day, I did not feel much sad as I was going to take up a very lucrative assignment as a military observer. I had the rare opportunity of celebrating my birth day lavishly with Scotch served by beautiful air hostesses at a height of 30,000 feet.

On the 23 August 2007 morning, our flight safely touched the runway at Kinshasa airport. Though it was called an international airport, it was similar to our Fort railway station. All the proceedings to checkout from the airport made me think how this airport got the title "International". Later we were "rescued" by the UN representative and took us to the mission Headquarters in the city. After the formalities were done, Mr Thusan Munasinghe and Mr Mohommed Muthariz, two Sri Lankan gentlemen working in the UN mission in Congo as IT consultants accompanied us to their residence. After two week long familiarisation training, I had my posting to a team site in the city while Major Sanjeewa got his posting to a team site in a periphery. So I had to share a house with Thusan and Muthariz in Kinshasa. My stay with them was so fun filled as they treated me nicely and respectfully.

Life in Kinshasa was quite comfortable compared to the other parts of the country. The city was densely populated and most of the rich people and the workers in foreign agencies lived in the capital. Despite the civil war and the unrest the country had engulfed in, Kinshasa had got everything one finds in any developed city, including super markets, night clubs, star hotels and of course all nefarious activities. Although Kinshasa had almost everything in the world, I noticed that there was no Sri Lankan tea in its super markets or any other shops. But Kenyan and Indian tea were sufficiently available.

My frequent visits to the "City Market", a super market close to our residence made me friendly with the manager of it. Over a chat, once I asked him why he does not have world famous Ceylon Tea in his shop. To my big surprise, he had never heard about Sri Lanka or Ceylon tea before. So I had to lecture him about my country and its famous tea. Further, I promised him to bring a packet of Sri Lankan tea for him next day. Fortunately, I had

brought plenty of tea packets from Sri Lanka and I witness the success of my operation as I saw many gave him one. On one weekend when I was shopping in his super market, he came running up to me with his wife and hugged me appreciating the tea I gave him. His wife told me that she had never tasted such tasty tea in her life before. I politely asked her to encourage her husband to make his customers also enjoy the luxury of tasting famous Sri Lankan tea. The manager thumped up and promised me to inform his dealer to supply Sri Lankan tea to the

I did the same thing with other super markets in the city too. After some time, to my elation I saw Sri Lankan tea in some of the super markets. But I found many people including UN employees were unaware or not interested about which country the tea that they drank produced. This situation led me to launch a campaign of promoting our tea in this cosmopolitan city. As a military observer, it is part of our job to meet the top government officials and politicians. In all this meetings, I made it a point to gift them a packet of Sri Lankan tea with some promotional explanation of its taste and reputation in Europe. I knew very well that most of the rich Africans like to blindly follow the Europeans just as many rich Sri Lankans do.

My next target was the officers who worked with me at Brigade I was attached to. Many of them were from neighboring African, South American, Middle East, Asian and Nordic countries. They were so interested in coffee than tea. My operation to convince them to drink tea was a bit unsuccessful. So I was compelled to use different tactics to reach my target. I quietly told them that our tea has an aphrodisiac strength. Within a week I was able to

Officers purchasing Sri Lankan tea in super markets.

The Staff Officer who handled the administration of military observers in the Brigade was Agnus Mahamba, a lady Captain from Malavi. By nature, she was a bit hostile towards military observers and does not show any amity especially towards Asians. Sometimes her behavior antagonised us but we were helpless as she was a close crony of Brigade Commander, another black Brigadier from Ghana. So I made up my mind to "kiss the hand that cannot be cut". Once I gave her a small Sri Lankan tea packet. She sarcastically told me that she does not drink tea. I asked her to just taste it. Next morning when I came to Brigade Headquarters, beaming Agnus delightedly shouted at me and held my hand appreciating our tea. What followed was lovely history. Many evenings I spent in the cafeteria sipping Sri Lankan tea with Agnus while all my Indian and Pakistani friends were enviously looking on.

After one year stint in Congo, the day dawned for me to leave Congo. To my elation and pride, on my departure from Kinshasa airport I was able to see the success of my "Solitary Tea Battle" as I saw some Sri Lanka tea in the duty free shops.

I arrived home next day evening and had a rousing welcome from my wife and two daughters. While my daughters were sweeping clear my baggage, I asked my wife to bring me a cup of hot tea. But to my surprise, instead of tea she offered me an egg coffee with a lopsided laugh on her face due to the reason best known to her.

Tips to Manage Your Finance







9 Sri Lanka National Guard Troops Gave Community Support to a School




New Battalions Formed to Uplift the National Agricultural Drive
