

'Leadership Traits' for Ruhunu Campus undergraduates



The AK-47, also known as the Kalashnikov or just AK, is a gas-operated assault rifle, developed in the Soviet Union by Russian small-arms designer Mikhail Kalashnikov. After more than seven decades since its creation, the AK-47 model and its variants remain one of the most popular and widely used firearms in the world. The model and its variants owe their global popularity to their reliability under harsh conditions, low production cost, availability in virtually every geographic region, with the ease of use. The AK has been manufactured in many countries, and has seen in service with armed forces as well as irregular forces and insurgencies throughout the world. However, did the military handheld firearms develop through time?

The hand cannon, also known as the gonne or handgonne, is the oldest type of small arms as well as the most mechanically simple form of metal barrel firearms without any form of firing mechanism. The hand cannon widely used in China from the 13th century and later Eurasia in the 14th century. These cannons

were loaded from the muzzle. The propellent charge lit through a touch hole. A small priming charge over the touch hole is ignited with a lit piece of slow match. Slow match, also called match cord, is the slow-burning cord or twine fuse used by early soldiers to ignite matchlock muskets and cannons. Slow matches were most suitable for use around black-powder weapons as it could be roughly handled without going out, and only presented a small glowing tip instead of a large flame that risked igniting nearby gunpowder. These hand cannons were ungainly: the difficulty being in holding and aiming the weapon while manipulating the slow match needed to fire it. Improvements to the basic design placed the touch hole and a priming pan (flash pan) to the side of the barrel.

An arquebus is a form of a muzzle-loaded long gun that appeared in Europe and the Ottoman Empire during the 15th century. Although the term arquebus, derived from the Dutch word Haakbus ("hook gun"), it applied to many different forms of firearms from

the 15th to 17th centuries. It originally referred to "a handgun with a hook-like projection or lug on its under surface, useful for steadying it against battlements or other objects when firing". These "hook guns" were in their earliest forms of defensive weapons mounted on German city walls in the early 15th century. The addition of a shoulder stock, priming pan, and matchlock mechanism in the late 15th century turned the arquebus into a handheld firearm and also the first firearm equipped with a trigger. The matchlock was a lever mechanism that simplified the ergonomics of firing. Slow match would be held clear of the flash pan in a spring-loaded pivoting arm (the serpentine). Actuating the trigger firing lever would release the serpentine, allowing it to rotate and dip the lit match into the flash pan. This reduced hesitancy at the moment of firing and thereby improved accuracy. The exact dating of the matchlock's appearance is disputed. It could have appeared in the Ottoman Empire as early as 1465 and in Europe a little before 1475.

A musket is a muzzle-loaded





long gun that appeared as a smooth-bore weapon in the early 16th century, at first as a heavier variant of the arquebus, capable of penetrating plate armour. By the mid-16th century, this type of musket gradually disappeared as the use of heavy armour declined, Howver, musket continued as the generic term for smooth-bore long guns until the mid-19th century. The differences between the arquebus and musket post-16th century are therefore not entirely clear, and the two have

been used interchangeably on several occasions. The matchlock arquebus is considered the forerunner to the flintlock musket and flintlocks not usually associated with arquebuses. The flintlock used flint striking steel to generate the spark. Slow match was often used from the 15th century until about 1630, when the flintlock started its rise to prominence. Slow match remained in use with limited numbers of matchlocks in Europe until approximately

with the ball in a sealed unit. This eliminated the operation of measuring the powder during loading. The paper also served as a patch in smooth-bore firearms, which fired balls that were smaller than the diameter of the bore, and wrapped a paper patch to make them fit snugly. The Dreyse needle-gun was adopted by the Prussian Army in 1841. The employment of the needlegun changed military tactics in the 19th century, as a Prussian soldier could fire five (or more) shots, even while lying on the ground, in the time that it took his muzzle-loading counterpart to reload while standing.

Rifles already existed in Europe by the late 15th century, but they were primarily used as sporting weapons and had little presence in warfare. Rifling, the addition of spiral grooves inside a gun barrel, imparts a stabilising spin to a projectile for better external ballistics, greatly increasing the effective range and accuracy of the gun. The balls had to be rammed down the barrel, sometimes with a mallet, because gunpowder residue would foul a rifled bore after a relatively small number of shots, requiring frequent cleaning of the gun. For this reason, smooth-bore muskets remained the primary firearm of most armies until the mid-19th century. The development of the Minié ball, designed by Claude-Étienne Minié in 1849, was significant because it was the first projectile type that could be made a loose enough fit



1730, and in Japan until the early 1900s. The "true" flintlock, also known as the French lock, appeared in the late 17th century.

The Dreyse needle-gun was invented in 1836 by the German gunsmith Johann Nikolaus von Dreyse. It was his adoption of the bolt-action breech-loading principle combined with the long needle driven by a coiled conchoidal spring which gave the rifle its military potential, allowing, as it did, a much faster rate of fire. The needle gun used a unitary cartridge, containing bullet, powder, and primer in a paper wrapper. Paper cartridges have been in use for nearly as long as handheld firearms. Their use became widespread by the 17th century. The most common applications of paper cartridges were in muzzle-loading firearms. While these may be loaded with loose powder and balls, a paper cartridge combines a pre-measured amount of powder



to easily slide down the barrel of a rifled long gun, yet maintain good accuracy during firing due to obturation by expansion of the bullet's base when fired.

The percussion cap, introduced in the early 1820s, is a type of single-use percussion ignition for muzzle device firearm locks enabling them to fire reliably in any weather condition. The discharge is initiated by striking a shocksensitive explosive material. The mechanism was otherwise constructed similar to that of the flintlock. This invention was gradually improved, and came to be used, first in a steel cap and then in a copper cap, by various gun-makers and private individuals before coming into general military use nearly thirty years later. The flintlock mechanism was readily adapted to utilise this new technology. Cap-locks were generally applied to the British military musket in 1842. The percussion cap brought about the invention of the modern cartridge case and made possible the general adoption of the breech-loading principle for all varieties of rifles, shotguns and pistols. French gunsmith Benjamin Houllier improved the Lefaucheux pin-fire cardboard cartridge and patented in 1846, the first fully metallic pin-fire cartridge containing gunpowder. In 1867 the British war office adopted the Eley-Boxer metallic centrefire cartridge case in the Pattern 1853 Enfield rifles, which were converted to Snider-Enfield breech-loaders on the Snider principle.

The Mauser Model 1871 was updated in 1884 with an 8-round tubular magazine designed by Alfred von Kropatschek, this the German making Army's first repeating rifle. The Lebel Model 1886 repeating rifle entered service in the French Army in 1887, and it has the distinction of being the first military firearm to use smokeless powder ammunition. In 1884, Paul Vieille invented a smokeless powder called Poudre B, white powder. This powder revolutionised the effectiveness of small guns because it gave off almost no smoke and was three times more powerful than black powder. Since less powder was needed to propel a bullet, the cartridge could be made smaller and lighter. This allowed troops to carry more ammunition for the same weight. Subsequently, Poudre B was modified several times with various compounds being added and removed.

1908, General Manuel Mondragón patented the world's gas-operated semiautomatic rifle, the Mondragón rifle, designated the M1908. The rifle was used by Mexican forces in the Mexican Revolution, making Mexico the first nation to use a semi-automatic rifle in battle, in 1911. Shortly after, France had its own semi-automatic rifle, the Fusil Automatique Modele 1917. The M1917 was fielded during the latter stages of World War I, where it did not receive a favourable reception among troops. However, its shortened and improved version, the Model 1918, gave complete satisfaction during the Moroccan Rif War

from 1920 to 1926. Other nations experimented with self-loading rifles during the interwar period. including the United Kingdom, which had intended to replace the bolt-action Lee-Enfield with a self-loading rifle, but this plan had to be discarded when the Second World War became imminent, shifting its emphasis to speeding up re-armament with existing weapons. In practice, they did not replace the bolt-action rifle as a standard infantry weapon of their respective nations. By the end of World War II, however, semi-automatic rifles had been largely superseded in military usage by their fully automatic counterparts limiting the viability of widespread deployment of semi-automatic rifles.

The first fully automatic rifle to see widespread usage was the German StG 44, which was well liked by troops, as the 30-round, selective fire rifle gave them much more flexibility than their service rifle, the bolt action Karabiner 98k. It was developed during World War II by Hugo Schmeisser. The StG 44 was the first successful assault rifle, with features including intermediate cartridge, controllable automatic fire, a more compact design than a battle rifle with a higher rate of fire, and being designed primarily for hitting targets within a few hundred metres. Other rifles at the time were designed to hit targets of over a thousand meters, but this was found to be in excess of the range in which most enemy engagements actually place. The StG 44 fulfilled its effectively, particularly on the Eastern Front, offering greatly increased volume of fire compared to standard infantry rifles. The StG 44 largely influenced the Soviet AK-47, introduced three years after the war concluded. The StG's influence can still be seen in modern assault rifles, which, after World War II, became the global standard for infantry rifles.




SLEME Officers educated on 'Best Practices in Vehicle Servicing'

Nothing is impossible for the brave warrior of the nation who was born from a heroic mother. Several heroic sons were born on this island to eliminate this peril from the suppressed communities of terrorism. When the time where the country was passing years of blue, the region of Pooneryn was not affluent with the fear of terrorism, which was instilled in every corner of the Northern area of the country.

It was 14 November 1993 and the battle of Pooneryn took its fearsome form with its enemy. LTTE code-named 'Operation Leap Frog' was the battle between Liberation Tigers of Tamil Eelam (LTTE) and the Sri Lankan military in this Pooneryn attack. LTTE mounted a surprise attack after encircling Pooneryn camp. In the first phase of the operation, Army and Navy troops broadened their presence in the Pooneryn area establishing a permanent base in 1991 to counter LTTE movements across the Kilali

lagoon from the Jaffna peninsula which was under its control. At the time, the Army camp in Poonaryn comprised troops from the 1 and 3 Battalions of Sri Lanka Light Infantry, Gajaba Regiment, and 4 Regiment of Armoured Corps. Due to this security circle, military bases in Pooneryn and Elephant Pass effectively obstructed LTTE movements between Wanni and Jaffna.

On 24 September 1993, the Army troops launched Operation Yal Devi and 108 soldiers killed during the operation. Several weeks later, the LTTE launched Operation Frog Leap to destroy the isolated military base in Pooneryn. This was the time when LTTE had begun to launch its brutal illicit activities day by day. On 11 November 1993, the LTTE launched a massive land attack by destroying the Nagathevanthurai naval detachment and the army defence lines in Pooneryn. The LTTE were able to capture the Punarin camp letting the Army soldiers face an unexpected assault from the lagoon and all the defence lines became under the control of the LTTE.

Not only this affects the Army troops but also the naval detachment and its installations including a radar station were also destroyed within hours by the brutal terrorists. Heavy fire from LTTE anti-aircraft guns prevented air support dispatched by the Sri Lanka Air Force. Within two or three hours large parts of the base were invaded. Due to heavy anti-aircraft fire from the LTTE, air support was also very difficult. However, the destiny of the LTTE was not allowed to keep that happiness for long. The navy executed an amphibious landing on 14 November 1993 enclosing fire from fast gunboats with the support of the newly formed Special Boat Squadron.

Heroes never waited as a mule before the threat. They are ready to exhibit heroism at any cost no matter what. The LTTE withdrew by the evening of 14 November 1993 and the army reestablished its base in Pooneryn once again. The military had to suffer heavy casualties. 8 Officers and 225 other ranks were killed, 17 officers and 545 soldiers were wounded and 302 soldiers missing in action since presumed dead.

Major T T R De Silva of the 1st Sri Lanka Light Infantry was given a field promotion for preventing the complete fall of the garrison. Two officers, Lieutenant A W M N M.De Silva of the 1st Sri Lanka Light Infantry and Lieutenant K W T Nissanka of the 3rd Gajaba were posthumously awarded the Weera Wickrama Vibhushanaya second highest award for combat bravery, in 1996, Nissanka's award was elevated to the Parama Weera Vibhushanaya the highest decoration awarded by the Sri Lankan military. Further, Lieutenant Nissanka, platoon Commander of the 3rd Battalion, Gajaba Regiment, which held the forward defence line till dawn, sacrificed himself.

At the time, the country was hampered by the terrorism that was spreading in every corner of the country taking several lives of innocents; many brave warriors had sacrificed their valuable lives for the sake of the country's sovereignty and territorial integrity. Patriotic sons descended from the generation of heroes bade farewell to the nation but their sacrifices shall forever remain in our hearts.


Method of Instructions Course No. 61 successfully ended

He was brought up amid the cherished care of his brother and sister. Unlike the other children of Gunasekara family, young Thissa was playful and active. At the age of 6, Mr. Gunasekara sent Thissa to the Rannagala pre-school before the start of schooling. Thissa entered Ranasgalla Primary School, Giriwulla in 1982.

During school, he was interested not only in studies in particular but also sports such as high jump and long jump. This enthusiasm for sports paved his way to participate in sports events of School Sports Meet hinting an assured future of developing athletes. His talents were also showcased as a juniour prefect of the school and as an energetic member of the school literary association, without neglecting the entrusted duties as a young gentleman. There had been no event the school held without his generous assistance until he passed out from the school. It was not only his school where he was concerned but also his village as a leading future leader. Thissa, was a compulsory member of any event held at the village no matter day or night. His participation in Sinhala and Tamil New Year Marathon was a frequent segment that villagers enjoyed.

His commitment to his Dhamma School was illustrated in various events where he associated including perahara possessions.

However, his urge interest to learn martial arts and selfdefence training never faded away. In time he decided to join the self-defence training class held at Kurunegala.

When little members of the family gradually grow, the family faced hardships as the father's livelihood as a carpenter was never adequate to run a threefamily. member Young Thissa with his blooming ideas of assured youth, decided to find an income to ease the family's burden. During this time, he had been a carpenter, and operator of coconut oil production factory. In the meantime, growing enthusiasm compelled him to join the Sri Lanka Army. He begged his parent's permission to join the security forces, but his beloved mother never had given her consent to the youngest child of the family as she shared a close bond with him. However, continuous appeal of the youngest son melted her heart. After taking their parent's permission, this brave young man joined the Sri Lanka Army on 30

September 1997 under Direct Recruitment batch No. 15 and was recruited to Sri Lanka Army Commando Regiment.

He completed his preliminary military training from Combat Training School, Ampara on 20 October 1997 to 30 December 1997 under Recruit Training No. 29 and scored the highest marks at competitions held during the training. The trams under his leadership always excelled a victory. This fact later served to send him to Commando Training School where the excellence is designed.

After successful completion of the commando training from 21 September 1998 to 28 October 1998, he was diverted to Commando Higher Course No. 26 on 24 March 1999 and exhibiting his warriorship he successfully passed out on 13 August 1996 earning the maroon beret opening a new chapter in his life. Thissa tuned to Private Gunasekara and excelled in any task he was assigned in. Within a short time, he earned the Poorna Bhoomi Medal, North and East Award for the illustrious service he rendered to rescue Muttur from the enemy grip under Operation Rivikirana I,II, and III and Jaffna, Kilali, Palai, Muhamalai under Operation Agnikheela. In 2000 Private Gunasekara was promoted to the next rank in recognition of his excellence at the battleground on various occasions. After promotion to the rank of Lance Corporal he was appointed as an instructor at Commando School, Uwa Kuda Oya. His strong bond with parents was always assured and there he decided to build a house for his parents.

Making his life more responsible, the young and bold Lance Corporal Gunasekara wedlock with young Miss Pradeepa Thilakarathne on 2 March 2005 and the young couple was blessed with a baby on 7 December the same year. At the time Lance Corporal Gunasekara was engaged in the operation launched to rescue Wakarai from the LTTE grip.

The first Commando Regiment was entrusted with the task to rescue the civilians kept as hostages by the LTTE in Mahindapura, Eechalanpattu, Verugal aru, Muttuaru areas.



Based on the information he received, a small team of Commandos planned to take the LTTE bunker line under control to secure the access without any hustle laying an ambush to surprise the LTTE. Lance Corporal Gunasekara with a small team planned to take control of the other bank crossing Verugal Aru. Amid LTTE fire with RCL, Mortar and Artillery, the team bravely marched forward. During the initial stage, Lance Corporal Gunasekara was hospitalised as a result of strong LTTE retaliation. Soon after recovering from severe injuries, he joined the operation illustrating his deep bond towards the motherland an example for the rest of the soldiers without considering the threat to his life. Due to this exceptional bravery, Lance Corporal Gunasekara was awarded Ransura Medal.

As a result of his incredible gallantry exhibited at East Humanitarian Operation, he was awarded Deshaputra Medal in the name of motherland. Consequently, he was promoted to the rank of Corporal due to his dutifulness and professionalism. At the time, Commandos were deployed at Mullaitivu area and launched a number of operations to rescue the area from the fatal terrorism. Pudukudurippu was a highly important strategic location for the LTTE, and they used it to lower the momentum of the government forces. Taking Mullaitivu under control was also entrusted to the team of Corporal Gunasekara of Commando Regiment. Following instructions of the Commanding Officer Corporal Gunasekara left the camp with 8 of his men in B team. Facing the ruthless

battles his team bravely countered and marched forward protecting his team members.

Gunasekara realised threat coming from the enemy is gradually escalating and is posing a risk to the lives of his comrades rather his. He instantly decided to ease this burden by targeting the enemy bunkers alone. He bravely attacked the LTTE walking towards cadres them while the they were firing at him. However, a strong retaialtive fire injured him during this engagement with another 18 comrades of B team of Commandos. 9 brave sons of Mother Lanka bravely sacrificed lives for the wellbeing of the nation at this ferocious attack. With the difficulty to summon the reserve, amid the approaching LTTE, Corporal Gunasekara was firmly determined to save remaining members of his comrades from the LTTE. Taking the LMG into his weapon Corporal Gunasekara bravely encountered the facilitating safe cover to own troops injured. A sudden unexpected LTTE attack took his life on 16 February 2009 ruthlessily. 15 July 2013, Corporal Gunasekara was posthumously awarded the Parama Weera Vibhushanava for his individual acts of gallantry and conspicuous bravery of the most exceptional order in the face of the enemy performed voluntarily whilst on active service with no regard to the risk of his own life thereby safeguarding the lives of his comrades.



A Great Press Baron, who was a Lieutenant in Ceylon Defense Force

Do you know that the Great Press Baron who once owned the Associated Newspapers of Ceylon Ltd (Lake House) in Sri Lanka was a Lieutenant in the Ceylon Defense Force (CDF) during the Colonial period in Sri Lanka? But I'm certain that most of the Sri Lankans are not aware about it. However, it is the truth that, Don Richard Wijayawardena, well known as D. R. Wijayawardena who was a successful businessman, entrepreneur, Press Barron and also later involved in the Independence Movement in Sri Lanka was a Lieutenant in the Ceylon Defense Force and he served in the Ceylon Light Infantry during the period of 1915 to 1917.

D. R. Wijayawardena was born on the 23rd February 1886 as the third son of a family of seven sons and two daughters. When junior Wijewardena grew up, his father Don Philip Wijayawardena, a well established timber merchant in Sedawattha and his Mother Helena Weerasinghe, both of them wished their son to obtain his secondary education at St. Thomas College, after he completed his primary education at Sedawattha School like all his brothers.

When the time passed by, young Wijayawardena enrolled at the University of Cambridge for his higher studies. He became a barrister after graduating with Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Laws from the University of Cambridge in England.

After returning to Sri Lanka (At that time Ceylon) young Wijayawardena started legal practicing at Hulftsdrop. During this era, in 1913 he entered into politics and he was unanimously elected as the secretary of the Ceylon National Association. While joining hands with W A Silva, young D. R. Wijayawardna became the joint secretary of the Ceylon Reform League. While showing his professionalism as a barrister, he took part in the notable Attorney General Vs Basnayake Nilame Case which almost led to the riots of Ceylon in 1915.

However, he too, was a crack shot and naturally, young D. R. Wijayawardena wanted to join the Volunteer Unit of the Ceylon Light Infantry and after the training period, he was commissioned



as a Second Lieutenant. During this era, young Wijayawardena was mobilised for the war service during the World War 1. While in the Military Service, young Wijayawardena got married to a beautiful young lady, Miss. Alice Gertrude Ruby Meedeniya in a grand Military Wedding Function which took place on 26th January 1916. Bride was the daughter of Mr. Meedeniya Adigar and Mrs. Cornelia Magdeline Senanayake. Blessed with two sons Ranjith and Seewali and three daughters inclusive of Nalini, Rani, and Kusuma, Lieutenant D. R. Wijewardena served as a Lieutenant until he had forwarded the papers for resignation on his own accord in 1917.

After withdrawing his commission from the Ceylon Light Infantry of the Ceylon Defense Force, young Wijayawardena had a very comfortable life style with his pretty wife and with the private income flowed to him from his family estates and landholdings. As he was not depending on legal practice, he had the time to manage these assets and gradually moved towards business activities. As a result of this, D. R. Wijayawardena was able to purchase the Sinhala Daily paper called Dinamina with the financial support of his brother D. C. Wijayawardena. Later, he was able to acquire another newspaper which was called 'The Ceylonese' from its proprietor, Sir Ponnambalam Arunachalam, for an amount of Rs 16,000/- (This was a very huge amount of money comparing to that Era) which published daily in English language. After renaming the newspaper as 'Ceylon Daily News' the very first issue of the newspaper came out from the press on 3rd January 1918.

However, as per the far sighted vision and the management skills of D. R. Wijayawardena, the "Ceylon Daily News" became one of the premier morning newspaper in Ceylon. When the time passed by, D R Wijayawardena was able to buy the Tamil language daily called 'Thinakaran'. In 1923, he managed to purchase the rights of another English Newspaper called 'The Observer' Accordingly, the seven newspapers inclusive of "Sunday Observer', The Observer' 'Daily News' 'Dinamina' (Sinhala Daily) 'Silumina' (Weekend

Paper published in Sinhala) 'Thinakaran' (Tamil Daily) and 'Sunday Thinakaran' (Weekend Paper published in Tamil) were consolidated under one roof by the name of 'Associated Newspapers of Ceylon Ltd (ANCL)'.

Under the guidance and instructions of D. R. Wijayawardena, then management of the ANCL started its operations to build a building along the banks of the 'Beira' Lake. Later, the proposed building was named as 'Lake House'. Also later on, D. R. Wijayawardena started several bus services to the remote areas of the country, with the intention of promoting and delivering of all the newspapers published under ANCL. This bus service later became a very popular public transport mode to the remote areas such as Kataragama.

D. R. Wijayawardena's family was a recognised prominent family in successful enterprises and Politics in Sri Lanka. Also two Chief Justices, two Prime Ministers and two Presidents of Sri Lanka came through the roots of D. R. Wijayawardena family. Also the present President and former Prime Minister of Sri Lanka, Hon. Ranil Wickremasinghe too, is one of the grand sons of the Great Press Baron and former Lieutenant D. R. Wijayawardena

Following the demise of this iconic character, D. R. Wijayawardena in 1956, as an honor to him, a street running along the banks of 'Baira' Lake was later named as the D. R. Wijayawardena Mawatha. However, in 1973, then Prime Minister of Sri Lanka, Mrs Sirimavo Bandaranaike had taken steps to nationalize the Company (Lake House) under the special provisions Act No:28 of the Associated Newspapers of Ceylon Ltd.
