ARMY MANUFACTURED VEHICLES FOR UN MISSIONS

Saving a large chunk of foreign exchange to the country troops of Sri Lanka Electrical and Mechanical Engineers (SLEME) handed over six vehicles of UN standards to the Special Task Force (STF) of the Police at the request of Ministry of Public Security. Under the project two new Armoured Personnel Carriers (APCs) and four Police Crowd Control Vehicles (PCCVs) were manufactured following the initiative of Lieutenant General H L V M Liyanage RWP RSP ndu Commander of the Army at a minimal cost of Rs. 66 m as against the estimated Rs. 100 m, saving Rs. 34 m. Those six vehicles formally handed over to the Inspector General of Police C D Wickramarathne and Deputy Inspector General of Police W Jayasundara, Commandant, Special Task Force on 25 July 2023 after inviting both of them to the Army Headquarters.

Each of those vehicles importation generally costs about Rs. 200 m for the country and, however, the Army managed it with Rs. 66 m for all six vehicles.

Mr. Horana Gedara Karunarathna Abesekara and Mrs. Mahakumbure Adara Chithralatha were blessed with a son, Horana Gedara Senarath Bandara on 26 April 1979, in Kurunegala. The family was happy with their new born son as a couple but they had never thought that his name would enter the history for his unwavering dedication and valour.

Senarath Bandara's journey in education commenced at K/ Samodya Primary School on 1 December 1984. He later attended Sri Anandarama Pothgul Viharaya in Kotikapola and Sri Rahula Dhamma School, where he honed his intellect and character.

In 1987, after he terminated his schooling, Senarath Bandara determined to achieve his childhood dream. Troubled by the scourge of terrorism that plagued the nation, he yearned to join the Sri Lanka Army to play his part in eradicating that menace. Initially met with reluctance from his parents, his persistence eventually won them over.

His recruitment into the Sri Lanka Army Regular Force on 26 November 1987, marked the beginning of a challenging military journey. Following rigorous training at the Training School of Vijayabahu Infantry Regiment in Puttalam under Course No. 24, he passed out as a regular infantryman on 20 February 1998, and was assigned to 8 Vijayabahu Infantry Regiment.

In the meantime, his excellence led to an internal transfer to 4 Vijayabahu Infantry Regiment, where he served with distinction in various conflict zones, including Paranthan, Elephant Pass, Weththalakeni, Chavakachcheri, and Kilinochchi frontlines.

In recognition of his outstanding abilities, Private Senarath Bandara was promoted to Lance Corporal on 31 December 2002. He continued to excel, earning a place in Junior Instructor Course No. 43 on 13 October 2004, and subsequently promoted to the rank of Corporal on 1 December 2004. Throughout his service, Corporal Senarath Bandara's dedication remained unwavering.

He met Miss. K Dardhani Nayana Weregoda during his deployment in Welikanda, and their friendship blossomed into a deep relationship. With the blessings of their parents, they tied the knot in formally registering their marriage on 5 May 2007, at Manampitiya Registrar Office. By this time, he had promoted to the rank of Sergeant.

Sergeant Senarath Bandara's leadership skills shone through during his deployment in Vavuniya, where he was appointed as the Section Commander of "D" Squadron. His exceptional leadership led to a successful attack on an enemy observation point and the destruction of enemy mortar positions. His dedication played a pivotal role in conquering Pulmude, earning him the prestigious "Rana Sura Padakkama" from the Sri Lanka Army.

As his career continued to flourish, Sergeant Senarath Bandara and his wife were blessed with a daughter, marking another significant milestone in his life. After a brief leave to celebrate the birth of his child, he reported to the Puthukkudiyiruppu Forward Defence Line.

On 22 February 2009, together with a group of 22 Other Ranks and an Officer, Sergeant Senarath Bandara

In recognition of his exceptional acts of gallantry and bravery in the face of the enemy, Sergeant Senarath Bandara was posthumously awarded the Parama Weera Vibhushanaya, the highest military decoration in Sri Lanka, on 19 May 2012, by His **Excellency Mahinda** Rajapaksha, then President of the Democratic and Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka and Commander in Chief of Armed Forces, during the 65th Independence Day celebrations.

joined an operation under Squadron "D," following the instructions of the 8th Infantry Division. Displaying unmatched courage, his team successfully navigated enemy traps and launched a surprise attack.

For this daring act, he was awarded the second "Rana Sura Padakkama," among several other medals, including the Wanni Humanitarian Padakkama, East Humanitarian Operation Medal, Purna Bhumi Padakkama, North and East Operation Medal, Rivirasa Campaign Service Medal, Sri Lanka Army 50th Anniversary Medal, and 50th Independence Anniversary Medal.

During the final phase of the Wanni Humanitarian Operation in May 2009, Sergeant Bandara and his team positioned themselves near the Nandikadal lagoon, preparing for an ambush.

When terrorists attempted to attack government forces in small boats, Sergeant Bandara's quick thinking and mortar artillery fire thwarted the enemy's advance. He then ensured the safety of his team members, keeping casualties to a minimum.


Sergeant Senarath Bandara observed the enemy advancing in a coordinated manner along the lagoon. He deployed with an ambush team under the cover of darkness. Using his radio, he promptly reported this enemy movement to higher-ranking authorities, displaying his sense of duty as a defender of his nation. As he assesses the situation, Sergeant Bandara realised that their only option for survival is to engage the encircling enemy in the darkness. Ensuring the safety of his wounded comrades, he assumed a leadership role, encouraging the remaining soldiers to join him in the fight

against the foe.

The battle intensified as the next day dawns. Tragically, Sergeant Senarath Bandara was wounded by a stray bullet during the battle. Despite his injuries, he valiantly continues to fight until his last breath, displaying incomparable bravery and unwavering commitment to his mission and fellow soldiers. However, Sergeant Senarath Bandara's fate did not permit him to continue the fight. Marking the end of another chapter in the story of a courageous War Hero, he bade farewell to his motherland.

In recognition of his exceptional acts of gallantry and bravery in the face of the enemy, Sergeant Senarath Bandara was posthumously awarded the Parama Weera Vibhushanaya, the highest military decoration in Sri Lanka, on 19 May 2012, by His Excellency Mahinda Rajapaksha, then President of the Democratic and Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka and Commander in Chief of Armed Forces, during the 65th Independence Day celebrations.

Sergeant Horana Gedara Senarath Bandara's life is a testament to the unwavering commitment and valor of a true War Hero who dedicated himself to the service of his nation, even in the most challenging of circumstances. His legacy lives on as an embodiment of courage and sacrifice in the defense of Sri Lanka.





The Angam warriors were highly skilled in combat and played vital roles in protecting the king, kingdom, and its people. They were known for their fearlessness, discipline, and loyalty.

Suppression under Colonial Rule

Angampora faced a significant setback during the colonial period, particularly under British rule in the 19th and early 20th centuries. The British administration sought to suppress any form of resistance or rebellion, and as a result, Angampora was banned. The British

perceived the practice as a potential threat to their rule and authority.

Preserving the ancient martial art

Over the years, there has been a concerted effort to preserve and promote Angampora as an essential part of Sri Lankan culture. Various organisations, training centers, and practitioners are actively involved in the preservation and transmission of Angampora knowledge. Exhibitions, demonstrations, and international competitions are held to showcase the art form's unique techniques and cultural significance.

While the historical records of Angampora may be limited, its legacy lives on through the passion and dedication of practitioners who strive to preserve its techniques, values, and traditions. As we look to the future, Angampora serves as a bridge between the past and the present, allowing us to honour and appreciate the martial heritage of Sri Lanka for generations to come.


BOXING TOURNAMENT


