In times of economic crisis, the concept of sustainability becomes increasingly critical, not only for state and civilian sectors but also for military organisations. The military, often characterised by its reliance on vast resources and high energy consumption, faces unique challenges when economic downturns occur. This essay explores how sustainability practices can be integrated in to military organisations to mitigate the impact of economic crisis while also addressing administrative concerns.

Furthermore, collaborations the private sector and academia accelerate research



CONCLUSION



Specialist Orthopedic Surgeon Army Hospital - Narahenpita

Colonel (Dr.) Lisitha Kularathne is a specialist orthopedic surgeon serving at Army Hospital - Narahenpita. The Senior Officer is a professional with extensive knowledge of various diseases related to the spinal cord and has successfully performed a number of emergency surgeries. He had his primary education from St. Benedict's College, Colombo and higher education from the Royal College, Colombo 07.

Later, he completed his medical degree from University of Sri Jayawardenepura. After joining the Military Academy as a Direct Enlisted Officer, he completed his training attached to the Sri Jayawardenepura Hospital, and promoted to the rank of Captain. As a Captain of the Sri Lanka Army he has served in Army Hospital at Gall Face in Colombo, Jaffna, Trincomalee and Wanni.

He was promoted to the rank of Lieutenant Colonel in 2011 and entered the University of Malaya Medical Centre in

Malaysia for advanced surgical training related to spinal cord of children and returned to Sri Lanka in 2015. After, completing 02 years of service at the 'Rockhampton' Hospital in the state of Queensland, Australia, he worked as a certified Medical Orthopedic Surgeon of the Sri Lanka Medical Council. In the meantime, he received a one-year training from the Royal Brisbane Women's Hospital in Australia on spinal diseases of adults.

The Senior Officer promoted to the rank of Colonel in the year 2019, as the first Sri Lankan surgeon with international medical qualifications and certification (Fellowship Internationally Qualified First Veteran Surgeon in Sri Lanka). Now he is serving attached to the Orthopedic Surgery Department of the Army Hospital in Narahenpita, Colombo.

This interview with him showcases his profound insights and diverse expertise in the field.

Question :-

What are the most common diseases in spinal code?

Answer :-

There are two possible diseases related to the spine. They are Traumatic and Non-Traumatic. Especially accidents, such as car crashcause 'traumatic' spinalinjuries. 'Non-traumatic' causes due to the natural aging, ingestion of poison through food or any other means, complications caused by cancer. Rarely, the same complications arise with birth defects.

However, the most commonly seen spinal complications among military personnel are bone fractures caused by accidents, severe muscle injuries and slip disc or nerve compression. Also, these conditions are primarily caused due to the improper strenuous exercise and rigorous drill activities and improper first aid measures or manual errors that occur when shifting an injured person from one place to another (way of lifting the patient).

When the patient's spinal cord is damaged it is immobilised forever. Therefore, it is more important to have the correct understanding of the first aid.



Question :-

Can participating in martial arts or bodybuilding lead to spine-related complications in the future?

Answer :-

This situation can be analysed as follows. Today, many people are engaging in unnecessary exercises in an incorrect way to shape their body, to develop muscles in the chest and arms, to remove the subcutaneous fatlayers accumulated in the abdominal areas, etc.

There is a risk for them to suffer from diseases related to the spinal cord due to the wrong postures during exercises. However, according to Charles Darwin's Theory of Evolution, humans have transitioned from a quadrupedal to a bipedal stance, making our posture muscles among the most crucial and powerful. This is called 'Bifid Posture'.

That means, we should pay more attention to keep the muscles related to the spine strong. Unfortunately, people working in many institutions in Sri Lanka, including the Army members, do not pay any attention to their spine in their daily activities and exercises.

Reportedly non-accident spinal problems are caused due to not maintaining accurate posture while performing the related activities. It's important to note that if someone experiences a spinal cord injury due to an accident (including road accidents), they should undergo a thorough medical examination at a hospital to check for possible complete or partial fractures of the spine and spinal cord. Providing the patient with essential first aid measures is crucial in such situations.

This situation is medically interpreted as "Unless proven otherwise, every patient has a spinal injury, hence spinal precautions to be taken during first aid and transport of the patient to a hospital" etc.

Question :-

What are the recommended postures for daily activities to protect the spine?

Answer :-

Poor posture often leads to back pain and discomfort because it places unnecessary strain on the muscles around the spine. When lifting weights, it's crucial to use proper technique to minimise strain on the spine. Strengthening the abdominal and back muscles with correct posture and techniques may reduce spinal stress and help alleviate back pain, which is especially beneficial for those with spine-related degenerative conditions.

Maintaining a straight and active posture while standing is important to avoid putting undue tension on the spine ligaments caused by slouching forward, which can lead to conditions like kyphosis (excessive outward curvature of the spine) and reduced thoracic cavity volume. When sitting, it's essential to use a chair that fits your body well, keeping your back straight and your hips and knees at a 90-degree angle. If your feet don't reach the ground, use a footrest for support.

Avoid prolonged sitting or standing to prevent unnecessary pressure on the back. When driving, sit comfortably with your elbows slightly bent, ensuring your lower back is supported against the seat. You should be able to extend your leg easily to press the brake pedal without straining your back.


Question :-

Can you provide a brief overview of the surgeries and treatments conducted by the Orthopedic Surgery Unit at Army Hospital in Narahenpita?

Answer :-

Currently, all orthopedic surgeries at the Army Hospital in Narahenpita are supervised by Senior Officers, Specialist Orthopedic Surgeon Dr. S D Karunaratne, and Brigadier Primal Peiris, based on collective agreements with other surgeons. The hospital has five full-time specialist orthopedic surgeons who meet daily to make treatment decisions for patients under their supervision.

This collaborative approach mirrors practices seen in developed countries worldwide and is unique among government and private



hospitals in Sri Lanka. Additionally, the Army Hospital in Narahenpita is the sole facility in the country equipped to handle surgical procedures for spinal deformities, including scoliosis, in both children and adults.

Question:-

Could you share some highlights of your successful career as an experinced orthopedic surgeon?

Answer :-

Certainly! I attribute a significant part of my success in surgery due to the guidance and mentorship I received from Professor Kwan from Malaysia and Dr. Yang from New Zealand during my medical training. Their expertise and teachings were invaluable as I practiced surgeries under their supervision. Following their guidelines and learning from their experiences has been instrumental in shaping my skills as a surgeon. Without their mentorship, I wouldn't have been able to perform surgeries successfully as I do today. I am grateful for the knowledge and insights they imparted to me during that crucial period of my career.

12 (V) ESR Clinches Victory at Inter-Regiment Drill Competition





Many of those addictions create complex mental, physical, social, and economic issues. Hence, identification or awareness of addictions is vital. However, the article focus on addictions for digital

using these digital devices and platforms seems simple and enjoyable, yet its constant engagement brings harmful consequences. Presently, it's common among males, females, kids, young people, middle-aged people, and even older generations.

As digitally educated and technological users, many may feel it is not as an addiction. But to understand the reality, there are some points to consider: Following simple guidelines provide the early signs of addictions.

Number 1 Inability to avoid or attempt to reduce the use of specific devices or devices.

If anyone seems, feels, or shows an inability to avoid or attempt to reduce the use of digital devices, there is an addiction. Thereby, the user is



trapped by its overuse, especially mentally and physically.

Number 2 Always having a mindset toward the use of digital devices.

Mentally, such a person has a thirst to use digital devices like social media apps, entertainment platforms, gambling applications etc. Thereby, they lose control over their other needs; and only think about spending their time on it.

Number 3 Uncontrollable feeling of using digital devices with the craving for missing something.

For example, while travelling, continuously check the devices (messenger or such related

applications) in search of something missing or feel someone has called or has sent a message.

Number 4

Do not concern about important things in life such as education, work, relationships etc.

Due to the usage of devices education, relationships, personal hygiene, roles and tasks of employment and many other things could be missed.

Number 5 Seemingly upset, anxious, unpleasant, or unmotivated when no access to the digital devices.

What are the specific types of addictions?

Among various types of addictions, the most commonly seen addictions are following.

Sex Addiction: This refers to seeking sexual desires via the internet. It may be pornography, photographs, or any other means of seeking sexual pleasure through digital devices.

Game addiction: Addiction to internet-based games where individuals seek pleasure in spending time with games and activities. Gambling Addiction: Gambling is also an addiction, but gambling via the internet and digital devices plays a different role, and paves the way to digital crimes and financial fraud. It includes online betting platforms, video games, and a series of various kinds of gambling.

Social Media Addiction: Social media addiction includes chatting, video photo uploading, and sharing thoughts through activities like spending many hours avoiding, missing, or neglecting other things in life which is of more importance.

Information addiction: This is a different kind of addiction where individuals seek information through

the internet

unlimitedly.

Since the information in par with their interests is available limitlessly on the internet, such individuals get addicted automatically. Due to their inexpiable craving, they search for information continuously via YouTube, web etc having no control over it.

Today everybody has internetconnected devices at their fingertips which provides the easy access to videos, chats, photos, stories, etc. However, once you are connected to the internet and started to search for pleasure activities, your brain automatically tends to release pleasure chemicals like endorphins. This will lose control over the use of the devices.

What can we do to control?

Accept your addiction. Try to understand that you have to get away from the addiction.

Start small. Don't try to make changes overnight. You have addicted little by little; you have to get rid of it in the same way.

Continue with support. You cannot do it alone; you need support. The initial step is to consult a mental health specialist. He/ she will guide you to get over it. Meanwhile, take the assistance of your loved ones or friends to help you in difficult situations (such as unknown addiction times).

Limit or avoid. Distract or uninstall any addictive applications. Keep regular intervals between the times of using the internet

for essential requirements.

Switch on to physical exercises. Instead of staying online try to go for a

staying online, try to go for a walk or play an available game like cricket, volleyball, football, cycling, hiking,

Practice mindfulness. Try

meditation, yoga, or engaging in religious activities related to your religion to heal and have control over your mind.

etc.

Have a goal. Always have a goal to overcome circumstances and then strive for it.

Be aware of triggers. Identify your triggers for addiction and be mindful of controlling them.

Further, we can't avoid using the internet or digital devices in this technological world. But we can have a control over it without falling into addiction. It's at our fingertips, not on others; therefore, learn to overcome an addiction.

Sinhala and Tamil New Year Arrives Jaffna Fostering Hope for a Promising

Future

As the nation ushers in the Avurudu season, this year holds a special significance for the Northern Province of Sri Lanka. Amidst the vibrant festivities and cultural celebrations, the people of the North are experiencing a renewed sense of hope and optimism, a departure from the challenges that have defined their recent past. For decades, the Northern citizens have yearned for a Sinhala and Tamil New Year where they could truly celebrate in freedom and peace. This year, their aspirations are closer to realisation than ever before, with many longstanding issues finally finding resolution.

The most notable transformation is the progress in addressing the burning concerns of civilians in the Northern Province. Land disputes - a longstanding grievance, are being addressed with the release of government-acquired lands back to their rightful owners. This move not only restores their rights, but also symbolises a step towards reconciliation and healing.





Another critical development of the area is the successful clearance of mines that once posed a grave risk to the safety and security in the villagers in Northern Province. The completion of demining operations has significantly improved the security and mobility of residents, allowing them to enjoy their public spaces with confidence. Also, the ancient kingdom, once isolated, is now witnessing a surge in tourism, marking a promising shift towards economic revival. The influx of visitors not only boosts the local economy but also unveil the region's rich cultural heritage and natural beauty to the world. Furthermore, agriculture, a cornerstone of livelihoods in the North, is experiencing a resurgence. The fertile lands are yielding abundant harvests, bringing prosperity again for farmers and their families. This agricultural revival not only fills pockets but also restore the self-sufficiency and empowerment among the agri-families.

In a significant breakthrough for the Northern civilians, a longstanding request to access their religious sites located within high-security zones has finally been granted by the Sri Lanka Army. This monumental decision has paved the way for believers to practice their faith freely at seven temples nestled within the Area of Responsibility of Security Forces (Jaffna). The list of temples now open for public veneration includes the Kaduwan Muttumari Amman Kovil, Vasavilan Manampirai Kovil, Vasavilan Shivam Kovil, Palali Naga Thampilan Kovil, Vasavilan Naga Kovil,Palali Raja Rajeswari Kovil and Palali Shaktiveli Murugan Kovil in Palali. These revered sites, previously inaccessible due to security concerns, are now welcoming devotees for

prayers and special poojas on a monthly basis.

The move to grant access for religious sites reflects a significant shift in policy, driven by the heartfelt requests of temple trustees and civil organisations in the area. Major General M G W W W M C B Wickramasinghe RWP RSP ndu psc, Commander of the Security Forces (Jaffna) responded to these appeals by affirming the importance of religious freedom while granting the necessary permissions for religious practices to be carried out unhindered. This development marks a significant moment of reconciliation and understanding within the



community. During the interview Major General M G W W W M C B Wickramasinghe RWP RSP ndu psc, Commander of the Security Forces (Jaffna) added that;

'The transition towards civil life in Jaffna and Kilinochchi districts is eventually underway.

The Sri Lanka Army has played a crucial role in providing essential services to support this return to normalcy. Additionally, His Excellency President's focused attention on Jaffna has been a significant boost for civilians striving to improve their quality of life.

During the His Excellency President's visit to Jaffna to oversee the distribution of lands, he emphasised that regardless of nationality, ethnicity, or religion, everyone has the right to own land—a message that resonated deeply with the local community.

This commitment was a major victory for the civilians of Jaffna. Collaboratively with government and civil authorities, efforts are underway to organise a special programme for land distribution. With exceptions made for lands necessary for security purposes, all other lands will be issued accordingly. The Commander of the Army has issued clear directives to facilitate this process, ensuring that civilians regain rightful ownership of their lands'

The shadows of a thirty-year-long conflict may have receded, but its impact still lingers through the everyday lives of Sri Lankans, affecting socio-economic and cultural environments profoundly. Since 2002, nineteen (19) institutions have stepped up to assist in the demining efforts, crucial for restoring safety and normalcy to affected regions.

Demining initiatives led by the Sri Lanka Army, have notably made remarkable progress within short duration. Vast areas—over 866.94 acres assigned to the Army and 473.25 square meters allocated to non-government organisations—have been successfully cleared of landmines. Accordingly, marking 99% of progress in process, Sri Lanka Army cleared 866.11 acres and government organisation cleared 451.92% acres.

These liberated lands which were not accessible are now reclaiming their purpose, enabling human activities and offering a new hope for a prosperous future. Soon these lands will be fruitful with the golden harvest. That is a great boost for economy in the country and also a good sign of the secured future. Simultaneously, efforts are underway to restore civil freedom and heal the wounds inflicted by terrorism in Jaffna. Balancing national security with civilian needs, the issuance of lands to locals represents a significant step towards reconciliation, and long lasting sustainable peace fostering a renewed sense of community.

In a significant move towards revitalising communities in Valikamum North, His Excellency the President recently allocated 234 acres of land, previously acquired by the Security Forces (Jaffna), for local civilians. This landmark decision aims to use these lands for agricultural development under the Agriculture Programme of the government. Further, Palali Smart Agriculture programme has initiated as a joint venture of the landlords and Security forces in the area. Accordingly, the lands released shall be again cultivated. Moreover, the Sri Lanka Army is facilitating a platform for the marketing and distribution of agricultural products, empowering local farmers to showcase and sell their agri-productions. This effort not only promotes economic growth but also strengthens community resilience and fosters a sustainable future for North region.

Sharing his perspective on the positive changes happening in Jaffna, District Secretary M. Pratheepan further added that;

Exciting changes are underway in Jaffna this year with a significant budget allocation of 322 million for



various projects under special development project. We've also submitted requests for 824 development projects to enhance the area. Also, Jaffna is being transformed into a popular tourist destination, attracting both local and international visitors in large numbers.

The resettlement process is nearing completion, and will be completed within next few months. Presently, only 34 displaced individuals of 10 families in three refugee camps are remaining in the area. Furthermore, the Security Forces in Jaffna have released 2,624.29 acres of land out of a total of 23,850.72 acres. The Sri Lanka Army has launched a number of projects to complete the resentment soon'

Jaffna is now becoming increasingly popular among both local and foreign tourists, bringing great relief and economic benefits to the people of Jaffna. The growing tourism industry is creating number of job opportunities directly and indirectly, benefiting the local community. During our visit to Jaffna, we met Arrur Subramaniyam Sami – an Indian who is currently engaged in a spiritual journey in Jaffna near Keeramale Pond.



We are from Thiruwel, Tamil Nadu, and we have about 40 members in our pilgrimage group visiting Sri Lanka. I last visited Sri Lanka in 2017, and I must say the country has developed significantly since then. One of the standout qualities of Sri Lankans is their hospitality. We invite all Tamil tourists to explore not only Jaffna but the entire country. During our pilgrimage, we are

performing several poojas (religious rituals) at Keeramale and other sacred places. We believe that the blessings of the Lord will be upon us during this journey' Arur Subramaniyam Sami shared his thoughts with us enthusiastically.

Mr. Thangathureyi Inbarasa - a resident in Jaffna, sharing his experience, explained that:



I live in Naleenapuram Village. Previously I was in the Konapura, Mallakam refugee camp. But I am from Myladi. Thanks to the intervention of the Sri Lanka Army, 165 families were fortunate to receive houses from Sri Lanka Army. Some still keeping photos of the Army soldiers who built

their houses. We are in debt to them forever for bring our lives back. Now we all are living happily here. There were many refugee camps in Jaffna but now only three camps remaining in the area. Sri Lanka Army has released much of lauds. We are grateful for the government. Recently, His Excellency the President released nearly two hundred and thirty acres of land for us including lands for agriculture.

These positive changes from Jaffna show signs of progress and growth, with the region flourishing alongside the south. These positive developments are not merely isolated occurrences but a collective feeling of hope and good future. For the first time in years, the Northern citizens are experiencing the progress and peace amidst the festive season. So, Sinhala and Tamil New Year this time brings all together, not only for festivities but also as a testament to resilience, unity, and brighter future for all Sri Lankans.




