During the visit, the Commander of the Army engaged in cordial interactions with Officers and Other Ranks, inquiring about their administrative and welfare requirements.








During the same programme, Chief Guest laid the foundation stone for a new 'Bodhi Prakaraya' (protective wall).

The Commander of the Army Unveils Deepaduththarama Viharaya Pagoda



Prior to this new appointment, Major General S R B Aluvihare RWP RSP ndu psc served as the Commander, Security Forces (Central).


New SLAVF Commandant Assumes Duties

However, when I took over my duties as the Brigade Commander of 212 Infantry Brigade under command to 21 Infantry Division, present Commander of the Army Lieutenant General H L V M Liyanage RWP RSP ndu, was then General Officer Commanding of 21 Infantry Division. Also, under his far-sighted vision, guidance and close supervision, I was able to continue the house construction projects successfully for the needy community in the area.

During that time, I was able to construct nearly 25 houses with all the modern facilities. Further, we were able to donate furniture and electric appliances for them. What are the measures you've taken to address the critical needs of the community in the area?





History of Chemical Weapons

The history of chemical weapons spans from ancient times to modern warfare, with significant developments occurring in the 20th century. Chemical weapons are toxic chemical substances designed and used to cause death, injury, temporary incapacitation,

or sensory irritation through their chemical action. These weapons can take various forms, including gases, liquids, or solids, and can be delivered via munitions, sprays, or other means. The definition of chemical weapons by the Organization for the Prohibition of

Chemical Weapons (OPCW) is:
"A chemical weapon is a chemical used to cause intentional death or harm through its toxic properties.
Munitions, devices, and other equipment specifically designed to weaponize toxic chemicals also fall under the definition of chemical weapons".

The historical accounts reveal that early civilisations often used toxic substances in warfare to gain a strategic advantage. While not as sophisticated or systematically deployed as modern chemical weapons, these early methods still demonstrated an understanding



of the toxic properties of various substances and their potential applications in conflict.

Ancient Civilisation

In ancient Greece, during the Peloponnesian War (431-404 BCE), the Spartans used a mixture of burning sulfur and pitch to produce toxic fumes, which they directed against the Athenians. Thucydides, a Greek historian, documented the use of these early chemical weapons during the siege of Plataea.

Ancient Indian texts, such as the Arthashastra written by Kautilya (4th century BCE), describe the use of poison in warfare. The text includes recipes for poisonous smoke and advises on poisoning enemy food and water supplies.

The Roman military also engaged in early chemical warfare. During the siege of Ambracia (189 BCE), the Romans used a combination of burning feathers and sulfur to create noxious smoke, which they directed into the city to disorient and weaken its defenders. During the Battle of Dura-Europos in 256 CE, the Sassanian Persian Empire used bitumen and sulfur crystals to create poisonous gas.

Archaeological evidence and historical accounts suggest that they set fire to these substances in a tunnel beneath the city's walls, producing toxic fumes that suffocated Roman defenders. These early instances of chemical warfare demonstrate the ingenuity and resourcefulness of ancient civilisations in using toxic substances to achieve military objectives. While the methods were relatively rudimentary compared to modern chemical weapons, they nonetheless reflect a significant aspect of ancient warfare tactics.

During the medieval period various cultures and civilisations developed and utilised toxic substances in warfare. While the sophistication and systematic deployment of these weapons evolved over time, the basic principle of using chemicals to gain a tactical advantage remained constant. One of the most famous medieval chemical weapons is Greek Fire, used by the Byzantine Empire starting in the 7th century. This incendiary weapon, which could burn even on water, was typically deployed through siphon-like devices on ships or through handheld projectors. Its exact composition remains unknown, but it is believed to have contained substances like naphtha, quicklime, and sulfur.

During the medieval period, Chinese alchemists discovered gunpowder, leading to significant advancements in both explosive and incendiary weapons. By the 10th century, they were also experimenting with poisonous smoke bombs. Chinese military texts, including the "Wujing Zongyao" (Collection of the Most Important Military Techniques) from the Song Dynasty (1044 CE), describe the use of "soul-hunting fog," a type of smoke bomb containing toxic substances like arsenic. These smoke bombs were designed to

create choking and blinding smoke on the battlefield. European and Middle-Eastern armies in the medieval period employed chemical substances such as quicklime (calcium oxide), which was used to blind enemy troops. In some cases, sulfur was burned to produce noxious fumes to create blinding and caustic smoke against their enemies. These instances highlight the creative and often brutal applications of chemical substances in medieval warfare, demonstrating a continuity of the principles of chemical warfare from ancient to medieval times.

Early Modern Period

The early modern period, which spans roughly from the 16th to the 19th century, saw significant changes in warfare and military technology. While chemical weapons were not as systematically developed or deployed as in later periods, there were still notable uses and developments in this era. Quicklime continued to be used in early modern warfare. It was deployed as a blinding agent when thrown at enemies. This practice, though not new, continued from medieval times into the early modern period, highlighting the continuity of certain chemical tactics.

The use of gunpowder significantly increased during this period, leading to the development of various explosive and incendiary devices that could produce toxic smoke. The combination of sulfur and other chemicals in gunpowder sometimes created asphyxiating conditions for troops. The early modern period was a time of significant alchemical experimentation. Various states and individuals experimented with poisons and toxic substances, sometimes incorporating them into warfare or assassination attempts.

The use of poisons, both in a covert and overt manner, was a form of chemical warfare practiced on a smaller scale. In China, the Ming and Qing Dynasties saw the continued use and development of gunpowder-based weapons. Chinese military manuals from the period describe various incendiary and explosive devices, some designed to produce toxic fumes. The early modern period witnessed the evolution of chemical warfare through the continued use of incendiary and toxic substances, building on medieval practices and incorporating new advancements in alchemy and gunpowder technology illustrating the ongoing exploration of chemical warfare tactics.

During World War I

World War I marks a significant and tragic period in the evolution of modern warfare. The extensive use of chemical agents during this conflict demonstrated their devastating potential and led to widespread horror and condemnation, eventually resulting in international treaties banning their use. The first large-scale use of chemical weapons in World War I occurred on April 22, 1915, during the Second Battle of Ypres.

The German Army released chlorine gas against Allied troops, causing devastating casualties and widespread panic. Chlorine gas, which causes severe respiratory damage, was initially deployed in gas cylinders and released when wind conditions were favorable. Its greenish-yellow cloud was a terrifying sight, causing immediate coughing, choking, and suffocation. After the initial success of chlorine gas, more deadly agents were developed. Phosgene, introduced later in 1915, was far more lethal. It caused severe pulmonary damage, often resulting in delayed death hours or days after exposure. Perhaps the most notorious chemical weapon of World War I, mustard gas (dichloroethyl sulfide) was first used by the German Army in July 1917. Mustard gas caused severe blisters on the skin and mucous membranes, and could be fatal if inhaled. Initially, chemical gases were released from cylinders, but as the war progressed, delivery methods became more sophisticated. Chemical agents were packed into artillery shells and mortars, allowing for more accurate targeting and increased range. The widespread use of chemical weapons necessitated the development of protective gear. Gas masks became standard equipment for soldiers on all sides, and armies developed various countermeasures to detect and mitigate the effects of gas attacks. Chemical weapons caused an estimated 1.3 million casualties during World War I, with

tens of thousands of deaths. The psychological impact was profound, instilling fear and trauma among soldiers and civilians alike. The use of chemical weapons in World War I marked a significant point in military history, showcasing the potential of scientific advancements to cause mass destruction. It also raised ethical questions about the conduct of war and the use of weapons of mass destruction.

In response to the horrors of chemical warfare during World War I, the international community sought to ban such weapons. The Geneva Protocol, signed in 1925, prohibited the use of chemical and biological weapons in war. However, it did not ban their production or stockpiling. The interwar period, spanning from 1919 to 1939, saw significant developments in the field of chemical weapons. Advances included the development of more lethal agents, improved delivery systems, and better protective gear. Researchers developed several new chemical agents during this period, including more effective forms of mustard gas and nerve agents. These developments were often kept secret, reflecting the ongoing military interest in chemical warfare. Although the Geneva Protocol was widely ratified, compliance varied. Some countries continued to develop and stockpile chemical weapons, while others adhered strictly to the treaty's provisions.

ARE YOU GASLIGHTING?

Are you Gas lighting?

Life resists simple explanation, as it encompasses a series of intricate interactions and events, each distinct from the other. According to the teachings of Lord Buddha, this concept is encapsulated in the eight-word principles (Atalodahama). In navigating social interactions. one must grasp the nuances of relativity. In relationships, self-doubt can arise from the comments or reactions of others. Initially, one may feel completely certain, but these external influences can introduce uncertainty. This phenomenon, known in the realm of psychology as 'gaslighting' (a form of psychological manipulation), is the subject of today's discussion.

What does this mean?

Simply, it's a sort of emotional abuse that makes someone questionable with his or her confirmation on something due to a manipulator's trick. Gas lighting generally happens under the estimation of someone's perception of reality.

How does term form?

The name originated according to the play 'Angel Street' staged in the United States in 1938 and later converted into a film called "Gas Light." The main cast of this film is a husband who exhibit manipulative behaviours. He attempts to highlight his wife; she was losing her mind. The trick the husband, used to manipulate his wife was making changes in their accommodation, in a strategic way. To accomplish his aim, he slowly and steadily dims the gaslight in the room.

As a result of these attempts, the wife tends to second-guess herself on things within her memory; thinking, guessing, etc. Meanwhile, it creates neurotic, fearful, and more sensitive (hypersensitive) types of behaviors. That's how this psychological manipulation got the name 'gas lighting'.

How can you understand the signs of gaslighting?

Loneliness and a sense of powerlessness: When those around you label you as crazy, worthless, a loser, or meaningless, it fosters a feeling of isolation and the belief that "I have no one," ultimately resulting in a sense of powerlessness.

Confusion: When gas lighters challenge your responses or information, you become confused, questioning whether you are correct or mistaken.

Feelings of inadequacy: Such interactions often lead to a pervasive sense of inadequacy, culminating in stress and frustration.

Struggling to Make Decisions: A lack of confidence and pervasive self-doubt make even simple decisions difficult to navigate.

Feeling Others' Disappointment: In such circumstances, you may feel compelled to apologise for even minor mistakes, employing this behavior as a defense mechanism to avoid others' disapproval.

Worrying About Being Too Sensitive: You may become overly concerned about your sensitivity, second-guessing whether others' criticisms are valid.

Feeling Terrible: The presence of a gaslighter can leave you feeling terrible or doomed.

The following signs can help identify gas lighting:

Disrespect: Gaslighters exhibit a lack of respect for others, focusing solely on their own perspectives and constantly asserting their correctness.



Lying: They lie to uphold their perceived superiority and to demoralise or instill doubt in others during conversations and interactions.

Disregard for Others' Feelings: Gaslighters are indifferent to others' emotions, caring only about their own and using this to confuse or create doubt.

Shifting Blame: They deflect blame onto others during unfavorable situations, attributing negative outcomes to others' perceived incompetence rather than accepting their own faults.

Suspicion: Gaslighters are consistently suspicious of others' thoughts, feelings, and behaviors.

Rejecting Misconduct: They never admit to their wrongdoings, instead shifting blame or outright rejecting any accusations.

Using Sentimental Words as Weapons: Gaslighters manipulate others by using emotionally charged statements like "I'm telling you

because I love you" to control and impose their ideology.

Distracting: They intentionally use distraction tactics to confuse others and divert focus when it is disadvantageous to them.

Discrediting: Despite widespread appreciation, gaslighters may discredit others due to jealousy or other motives, finding pleasure in undermining others' successes.

Why do people engage in gaslighting?

Various factors contribute
to gas lighting behaviour,
Prominently including nature and
nurture influences. Individuals
with personality disorders such
as borderline, narcissistic, and
antisocial tendencies are particularly
prone to gaslighting. Beyond these,
a multitude of factors collectively
influence such behaviors.

How to handle interactions with gaslighters?

Control Your Emotions: Do not display excessive sensitivity; manage your emotions, whether happiness or sorrow, to avoid giving the gaslighter leverage.

Seek Professional Help: If you endure long-term suffering and feel a loss of control, this can negatively impact your life. Consulting a qualified mental health professional is crucial in such cases.
