



Inaugurates








Indian Higher Defence Management Course Representatives Meet Commander Security Forces (Central)

mong the various illustrious regiments, the Gajaba Regiment raise prominently, epitomising the legacy of the ancient valiant King Gajaba. Over its distinguished history, the Regiment has made significant contributions in various perspectives, including defence and sports. The Regimental Day of the Gajaba Regiment falls on 14 October 2024, marking a remarkable milestone of 41 years of excellence.

The Gajaba Regiment was established on 14 October 1983 under the visionary leadership of Major General W I V K M Wimalarathne PWV RWP RSP VSV USP psc. This regiment was formed as a result of the amalgamation of the 1st Battalion of the Rajarata Rifles and the 1st Battalion of the Vijayabahu Infantry Regiment, as per the directive from Army Headquarters to form a new infantry unit known as "Nawa Pabala Ekakaya". This newly formed regiment was designed to guard the country's law and order.

The designation "Gajaba Regiment" was ultimately adopted, as a homage to the heroic King Gajabahu. In Sinhala literature texts, "Gajaba" refers to "strong arms of elephants," symbolising power and strength. Following the deep rooted tradition to locate in the Grate City Anuradhapura by the Grate Kings of all times, the Regimental Centre of the Gajaba Regiment was also established in Anuradhapura recognising the historic significance while representing heroism, valour, and courage.





The 1st Battalion of the Gajaba Regiment was officially commissioned on 14 October 1983, marking a significant chapter in the history of the Sri Lanka Army at the time where Major General W I V K M Wimalarathne PWV RWP RSP VSV USP psc at the time when he served as the first Commanding Officer of this infantry battalion as a Lieutenant Colonel earning the due title of founding father of the Gajaba Regiment.

Since its inception, the valiant Gajaba Regiment has imprinted its name into history as one of the strongest infantry regiments, participating in number of military operations such as the Vadamarachchi Operation which aimed at eradicating terrorism from the motherland as a part of the Vanni Humanitarian Operation. Notably, the 53rd, 55th, 57th, 58th, and 59th Divisions, which played pivotal roles on the battlefield during the Northern Humanitarian Operation, were led by Commanders nurtured by the Gajaba Regiment. These War Heroes had solemnly dedicated to extinguish the curse of terrorism from the nation.

The success achieved during the Vanni Humanitarian Operation marked a historic turning point for the Gajaba Regiment, exhibiting valour of its War Heroes who revived the spirit of ancient kings by bringing the scattered pieces of the nation together with their grate efforts.

In recognition of the gallantry demonstrated on numerous occasions, the President of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka conferred the President's Colours and Regimental Colours upon the Gajaba Regiment on 16 January 2017. This remarkable honour entered the Gajaba Regiment as the first infantry regiment in the history of the Sri Lanka Army awarded both colours simultaneously, well establishing its place in military history.

The Gajaba Regiment, having successfully completed forty years of excellence has emerged as a well-established defender of all ethnicities in Sri Lanka. Throughout its proud history, the regiment has produced remarkable leaders who have held prestigious

positions, including His Excellency the President of the Democratic Socialist People's Government of Sri Lanka, the Secretary of Defense, the Chief of Defense Staff, and the Commander of the Army, leaving an impressive mark on the 75-year history of the nation.

In its 41-year journey, the Gajaba Regiment has produced General Shavendra Silva WWV RWP RSP VSV USP ndc psc MPhil, who became the first Chief of Defense Staff and the first Commander of the Army to rise to the rank of General under the flag of Gajaba Regiment. Continuing this legacy, Lieutenant General H L V M Liyanage RWP RSP ndu presently serves as the Commander of the Army.

The Gajaba Regiment's contributions extend beyond defense. It has also made significant victories in various fields, including sports. Notably, Warrant Officer 1 Dinesh Priyantha achieved a historic milestone by winning a gold medal in javelin throw at the 2020 Paralympic Games held in Tokyo, Japan. His remarkable performance entered into records as the highest achievement by a Sri Lankan in the history of the Paralympic Games. He won two Olympic medals while becoming the first and only Sri Lankan to reach such heights in the field of world sports, adding immense pride to the Gajaba Regiment's legacy.

Over the past forty years, 171
Officers and 4,068 Other Ranks of
the Gajaba Regiment have made
the supreme sacrifice as patriots in
defense of the nation. Additionally,
307 Officers and 5,646 Other Ranks
have undergone rehabilitation and
recuperation during the regiment's
39-year history, underscoring the
commitment and resilience of its
members.

In recognition of the valiant service rendered by the gallant Keterians of the Gajaba Regiment throughout various periods, the regiment has been honoured with numerous accolades, including 4 Parama Weera Vibhushanaya (Supreme Heroism Decorations), 65 Weera Wickrama Vibhushanaya (WWV), 3 Weerodara Vibhushanaya (WW), 774 Rana Wickrama Padakkama (RWP), and 3,919 Rana Sura Padakkama (RSP).

Today, this proud regiment comprises 12 Regular Battalions, 4 Volunteer Battalions, and one Regimental Headquarters Battalion, confirming its status as the strongest infantry regiment in the Sri Lankan Army.

Commemorating its 41 years of distinguished service, a simple yet dignified event took place at the Regimental Center on 13 and 14 October 2024, under the patronage of Major General M G W W W M C B Wickramasinghe RWP RSP ndu psc, Colonel of the Regiment, with the Officers and Other Ranks. The commemoration commenced on 13 October 2024 with a Dhamma Sermon led by the Venerable Maha Sangha held at the beautifully constructed Pirith Mandapa within the Regimental Center premises. This event invoked blessings for the fallen Keterians while wishing for the speedy recovery of rehabilitating Keterians, civil servants, and their families.

On the same day, a memorial ceremony was conducted to honour the brave Keterians who sacrificed their lives to preserve the sovereignty and territorial integrity of the nation under the graceful participation of Colonel of the Regiment, Gajaba Regiment.

The official anniversary ceremony commenced on 14 October 2024 according a Guard Turnout and a Guard of Honour for the Colonel of the Regiment. Brigadier G A T Godewatta RWP RSP, Centre Commandant of the Gajaba Regiment, warmly welcomed the Colonel of the Regiment, Gajaba Regiment to the anniversary events. Following a floral tribute to the monument of the founding father, the Colonel of the Regiment addressed the Keterians. Many Keterians participated in the event highlighting the unity and pride of the regiment.



Diamond Jubilee

This year marks a historic milestone for the Sri Lanka Army as it celebrates its diamond anniversary—75 years of unwavering dedication to safeguard the nation's sovereignty, territorial integrity, and independence. Since its inception on 10 October 1949, Sri Lanka Army stood at the forefront of national security, defending the motherland and its people against visible or invisible challenges. At the moment where the establishment celebrates its diamond jubilee on 10 October 2024, it is the prime time to honour the sacrifices of all who contributed to shape this illustrious journey from then to the present leadership.

Lieutenant General H L V M Liyanage RWP RSP ndu, who played a pivotal role in humanitarian operations to end a 30-year prolonged war, currently, serves as the 24th Commander of the Army. Under his leadership, Sri Lanka Army continues to uphold its dedicative mission in defending the nation progressively. His leadership, shaped by years of experience and valour, reflects the unyielding commitment of the institution towards its duties and responsibilities. The current Commander-in-Chief, His Excellency the President Anura Kumara Dissanayake, also plays a vital role in guiding the Army's vision and progress, alongside Honourable Prime Minister Dr. Harini Amarasuriya and Secretary of Defense Air Vice Marshal Sampath Thuyacontha (Retd) to fulfill the aspirations of the Nation in





the coming years.

A Legacy of Sacrifice and Valour

The Sri Lanka Army's history deeply connected with the nation's struggle to maintain sovereignty and territorial integrity of the country. Its role in the elimination of 30 years prolonged terrorism is one of the most defining chapters in its legacy. Valourous and dedicated troops of the Sri Lanka Army successfully terminated the bitter, decades-long menace of terrorism, which tore apart families and communities on 18 May 2009, bringing hope for a new beginning. The war, initiated with the assassination of Jaffna Mayor Alfred Duraiappah in 1975 by Velupillai Prabhakaran, culminated in a hard-earned victory, paying with blood and tears of thousands of soldiers and civilians.

The Humanitarian Operations against Fourth Eelam War launched on 26 July 2006, under the command of Field Marshal Sarath Fonseka under the leadership of His Excellency President Mahinda Rajapaksa marking a decisive turning point in the nation's history. The operation named "Eastern Humanitarian Operation," aimed to restore basic needs and protect civilians from the atrocities committed by the Liberation Tigers of Tamil Eelam (LTTE). The war reached a critical point when the LTTE blocked the Mavil Aru sluice gate, depriving 30,000 civilians' access to the water. This marked the beginning of a humanitarian effort to liberate the area to secure the region bringing the peace.

Following the Eastern Humanitarian Operation, the focus shifted to the North, where the LTTE had consolidated its power. The Northern Humanitarian Operation, initiated with the goal of liberating the Northern Province, was an arduous and strategically complex. A key moment in this operation was capturing the Silavathura Sea Tiger base in 2007 - a crucial supply hub for the LTTE. The combined Armed forces of the Army and Navy decisively captured the north - west supply hub of the foe.

The ultimate victory in May 2009 not only signified the end of terrorism in Sri Lanka but also opened a new chapter for the country. Yet, it

came at a great cost. Over 23,562 Army personnel were either killed or reported missing in action, and more than 23,200 were injured. However, Sri Lanka Army's immense sacrifice was recognised through numerous gallantry awards and accolades of total 33131, including 29 Parama Weera Vibhushanaya (PWV), the nation's highest military honour awarded for supreme heroism, along with 18 Weerodara Vibhushanaya (WV), 312 Weera Wickrama Vibhushanaya (WWV), 5,101 Rana Wickrama Padakkama (RWP), and 27,671 Rana Sura Padakkama (RSP) medals.

Nation Building and Rehabilitation

While the Army's primary mission is to safeguard national security, its contributions to post-war rehabilitation, reconciliation and nation-building have been equally commendable. After the end of the war, the Army took a leading role in rehabilitating and resettling displaced civilians and ex combatants in the Northern and Eastern Provinces, working tirelessly to restore normalcy in wartorn areas. These efforts helped to mend the fabric of society, enabling communities to heal and rebuild their lives

The Army's involvement in national development has extended far beyond its main responsibility. It has played a significant role in assuring best healthcare service, infrastructure development, education, agriculture, and cultural reconciliation initiatives. The projects such as the "East Navodaya" number of infrastructure initiative and a range of agricultural ventures initiated, contributing the country's economic progress. Successful agricultural projects have launched at Vellankum, Menikfarm, Adiapulianthulam, Neeraviya, Kandakadu, Galkanda, Balella, Yala Palatupana Farm and Aralaganwila Agricultural Training School, Army Headquarters Agricultural Project, Kohilawagurawatta Regimental Farm helping to boost food security and contribute to the development of nation's agricultural production. In addition, the agri projects initiated by the Sri Lanka Army Corps of Agriculture and Livestock at every Army Camps have successfully progressed achieving its desired

objectives.

In line with former President's vision for a self-sustaining Army, the Commander of the Army, Lieutenant General H L V M Liyanage RWP RSP ndu took actions to expand the agricultural initiatives across the country. Notably, the Sri Lanka Army Corps of Agriculture and Livestock has implemented projects to produce food for the consumption of the Army. The surplus harvests distributed among the public through government programmes. In 2024, the Army has successfully handed over 10 metric tons of rice to the government's rice subsidy programme, marking a significant step toward reducing the Army's dependence on government funds for rations.

The modernisation of the Weyangoda Machinery Complex as Army Ordnance Industries, is another major achievement. The facility, once abandoned, has been revitalised to manufacture essential goods such as iron beds, hardware, garment products, tyre re-stitching, bed sheets and pillows etc. uniforms required for training recruits, shorts, helmets, work clothes, t-shirts, all types of packs, raincoats, ponchos capes, vehicle canopies. All types of camping tents, all types of belts, assault jackets, flak jackets and other special equipment worn by Officers and Other Ranks are also produced.

In the factory saving millions in foreign exchange and reducing procurement costs up to 40%. This self-sufficiency highlights the Sri Lanka Army's broader economic contribution, which extends beyond the battlefield.

Responding to National Emergencies and Disasters

The Sri Lanka Army has also consistently demonstrated its readiness to assist nation during natural disasters and national emergencies. From 2004 Tsunami to the Meethotamulla landslide and the COVID-19 pandemic, the Sri Lanka Army has been at the forefront of rescue and relief operations. In particular, the establishment of the Sri Lanka Army Center for Disaster Response Training in Gampola is a significant milestone that marks the Army's proactive approach





in preparing for future disasters. This center offers research and training in civil-military operations, ensuring the ability of Sri Lanka Army to handle both domestic and international crises.

Moreover, the Army's commitment to restraining illegal activities, such as drug trafficking, further underscores its role as a guardian of the nation's future in the perspectives of its social fabric. Under the direction of the Commander of the Army Lieutenant General H L V M Liyanage RWP RSP ndu, the troops have ramped up intelligence and operational efforts to control the menace of narcotic drugs, seising quantities of hashish, kush, and other illicit substances to safeguard future generations from the perils of addiction.

International Recognition in Peacekeeping

The Sri Lanka Army has also earned international acclaim for its contributions to United Nations peacekeeping missions. Since its first deployment, Sri Lanka troops have been deployed in conflict zones worldwide such as Haiti, Lebanon, South Sudan, the Republic of Chad, and Mali. To date, more than 20,775 soldiers have served under the UN flag, earning Sri Lanka close to \$300 million in foreign exchange.

Adding to its list of achievements, the Sri Lanka Army has developed the Unicom/Unibaffle vehicles, which used in UN peacekeeping missions. Manufactured by the Sri Lanka Electrical and Mechanical Engineers Corps (SLEME), these vehicles used at Sri Lankan Combat Convoy Company comply with international standards, saving significant foreign exchange while enhancing the Army's technical capabilities.

Excellence in Sports

Sri Lanka Army has long demonstrated a strong commitment to the field of sports, both national and international stage. Apart from the main role as the defender of the nation, Sri Lanka Army also contributed to the nation's sporting achievements across various disciplines fostering unity and harmony. From cricket to boxing and rugby, archery, sepaktakraw, javelin throw, kayaking, the Sri Lanka Army has consistently excelled producing talented athletes who have achieved the national and international levels.

Warrant Officer II Samitha Dulan earned the silver medal in the Paralympics F-44 Javelin throw, marking a significant global accomplishment. Corporal Aruna Dharshana and Staff Sergeant Nadeesha Lekamge earned the prestigious honuor of representing Sri Lanka at the Paris Olympics while Staff Sergeant Nadeesha Ramanayake won the gold medal in the 400 meters at the Asian Athletics Championship..



he political landscape in South Africa began to change in the late 1980s. Under President F.W. de Klerk, the apartheid regime started negotiating with the African National Congress (ANC) and began steps toward dismantling apartheid. As part of this process, and due to a decreasing threat perception with the end of the Cold War, South Africa decided to dismantle its nuclear arsenal. In 1989, South Africa dismantled its nuclear weapons programme in secret. The

uranium cores were extracted, and the weapons were disassembled. By 1991, South Africa had fully dismantled its nuclear devices and had adhered to the Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons (NPT) as a non-nuclear weapon state. In 1993, South Africa publicly disclosed the existence and dismantling of its nuclear programme. After dismantling its nuclear arsenal, South Africa allowed the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) to verify the complete dismantling of its

nuclear weapons programme.
This transparency helped to improve South Africa's international standing and opened the door for its reintegration into the global community. South Africa remains the only country to have developed nuclear weapons and then voluntarily dismantled its entire arsenal. This act set a precedent in non-proliferation history, showing that disarmament is possible even after a country has crossed the nuclear threshold. South Africa's decision to dismantle its nuclear



weapons program and join the NPT has had a positive influence on non-proliferation efforts. It has been cited as an example for other countries, demonstrating that international isolation due to nuclear weapons can be overcome by adhering to non-proliferation norms.

India's nuclear journey began with the establishment of the Atomic Energy Commission (AEC) in 1948, under the leadership of Dr. Homi J. Bhabha. The focus initially was on peaceful uses of nuclear energy, aligning with Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru's vision. The commissioning of the Apsara Research Reactor in 1956 at Trombay marked India's first major nuclear milestone. Apsara was Asia's first research reactor. China's successful nuclear test in 1964 significantly influenced India's strategic calculations, leading to increased emphasis on developing indigenous nuclear capabilities. India conducted its first nuclear test on 18 May 1974, under the codename "Smiling Buddha" at Pokhran. The device was an implosion-type bomb using plutonium-239, with a yield of approximately 12 kilotons of TNT. This test was a milestone in India's nuclear program and marked its entry into the nuclear weapons club, making India the sixth nation to possess nuclear weapons. This was a "peaceful nuclear explosion" (PNE), indicating India's technological capability without explicitly pursuing weaponisation. After 1974, India maintained a policy of nuclear ambiguity, refraining from further tests but continuing to develop its nuclear infrastructure and capabilities. On 11 and 13 May 1998. India conducted a series of five nuclear tests at Pokhran. termed "Operation Shakti." These tests included both fission and thermonuclear devices. Following these tests, India declared itself a nuclear weapon state and adopted a "No First Use" (NFU) policy. In 1999, India released its nuclear doctrine, which was later formalised. It emphasised a credible minimum deterrent, NFU policy, and massive retaliation in the event of a nuclear attack. India has continued to develop and enhance its nuclear arsenal, focusing on a triad of delivery systems: land-based ballistic missiles, air-launched

weapons, and submarine-launched ballistic missiles (SLBMs). Key developments include the Agni series of ballistic missiles and the INS Arihant-class nuclear-powered submarines.

Pakistan's nuclear ambitions began in the 1950s, soon after its independence in 1947. The focus initially was on peaceful nuclear energy. The Pakistan Atomic Energy Commission (PAEC) was established in 1956 to oversee nuclear research and development. The 1971 Indo-Pakistani War, which resulted in the creation of Bangladesh, was a pivotal moment. Following this defeat, Prime Minister Zulfikar Ali Bhutto declared that Pakistan would develop a nuclear bomb, stating famously, "We will eat grass, even go hungry, but we will get one of our own [atomic bomb]." Dr. Abdul Qadeer Khan, a metallurgist, played a crucial role in the development of Pakistan's nuclear capabilities. He brought in knowledge from Europe, particularly about uranium enrichment. India's first nuclear test in 1974 (Smiling Buddha) further motivated Pakistan to expedite its nuclear weapons programme. Throughout the 1970s and 1980s, Pakistan focused on acquiring technology and materials necessary for building a nuclear weapon. including centrifuge technology for uranium enrichment. On 28 May 1998, following a series of nuclear tests by India, Pakistan conducted its own nuclear tests (Chagai-I and Chagai-II) in Balochistan in the Chagai Hills. These were plutonium-239 implosion-type devices with an estimated yield of 6-12 kilotons of TNT per

device. These tests demonstrated Pakistan's nuclear capability to the world. The international community, particularly the United States, imposed sanctions on Pakistan (and India) following the tests. However, these sanctions were later lifted in the context of broader geopolitical considerations, especially after 9/11. Pakistan maintains a policy of minimum credible deterrence and has developed a nuclear triad, including land-based missiles, aircraft-delivered bombs, and submarine-launched missiles.

Iran's nuclear programme began in the 1950s under Shah Mohammad Reza Pahlavi, supported by the United States through the "Atoms for Peace" programme. This initiative aimed to promote peaceful nuclear energy use, but the Shah's regime also had ambitions for nuclear weapons, given regional threats and aspirations for regional dominance. In the 1970s, Iran established the Atomic Energy Organization of Iran (AEOI) and signed a deal with West Germany to construct the Bushehr Nuclear Power Plant. France also agreed to supply a uranium enrichment facility and reactors. Iran signed the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty (NPT) in 1968, committing to nonmilitary use of nuclear technology, which was ratified in 1970. Following the 1979 Islamic Revolution, the new Iranian government, led by Ayatollah Khomeini, initially opposed nuclear weapons on religious grounds. The revolution caused Western nations to halt cooperation and assistance with Iran's nuclear programme, leading to a temporary stagnation. During the Iran-Iraq War (1980-1988), Iran faced significant





military and economic challenges. The devastating conflict, during which Iraq used chemical weapons, highlighted Iran's vulnerability and led to renew interest in enhancing defense capabilities, including potential development of nuclear technology. In the 1990s, Iran resumed its nuclear activities more earnestly. The country signed agreements with Russia to complete the Bushehr Nuclear Power Plant and initiated secretive programs to develop uranium enrichment and heavy water capabilities. By the mid-1990s, reports began to surface about undeclared nuclear sites and potential enrichment activities. In 2002, Iranian dissidents revealed the existence of the Natanz uranium enrichment plant and the Arak heavy water facility, escalating international fears of a clandestine weapons programme. The International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) launched investigations into Iran's nuclear activities, which culminated in a series of United Nations Security Council resolutions from 2006 onwards, demanding Iran suspend all enrichment-related activities and imposing economic sanctions. Between 2003 and 2015, Iran was engaged in intermittent negotiations with the P5+1 group (the five permanent UN Security Council members and Germany) aimed at limiting its nuclear program. Despite temporary agreements like the 2003 Tehran Declaration, the international community remained skeptical of Iran's intentions. In 2015, Iran and the P5+1 reached the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action (JCPOA), commonly known as the Iran Nuclear Deal. Under the agreement, Iran agreed to limit its uranium enrichment activities. reduce its stockpile of enriched uranium, and allow comprehensive IAEA inspections in exchange for the lifting of economic sanctions. In 2018, the United States, under President Donald Trump, unilaterally withdrew from the JCPOA and reimposed severe sanctions on Iran. leading to Iran gradually reducing its commitments under the deal. As of recent years, diplomatic efforts have continued to revive the JCPOA or reach a new agreement, but tensions remain high due to ongoing uranium enrichment activities and regional geopolitical conflicts.

North Korea's nuclear weapons programme has been one of the most significant and controversial developments in international security over the past several decades. North Korea's nuclear ambitions date back to the 1950s, with the establishment of the Atomic Energy Research Institute and the Yongbyon Nuclear Scientific Research Center in 1962. North Korea received significant technical assistance from the Soviet Union, to build the first research reactor in Yongbyon in the 1960s. In the 1980s, North Korea expanded its nuclear research facilities at Yongbyon, including a 5 MWe graphite-moderated reactor and a reprocessing facility capable of extracting plutonium from spent nuclear fuel. In the early 1990s, the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) detected inconsistencies in North Korea's nuclear declarations and requested special inspections, which North Korea refused. This led to the first nuclear crisis, with North Korea announcing its intention to withdraw from the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty (NPT) in 1993. The crisis was defused in 1994 with the Agreed Framework between the United States and North Korea, in which North Korea agreed to freeze its illicit plutonium weapons program in exchange for aid in building two light-water reactors and the provision of heavy fuel oil. The Agreed Framework began

to collapse in the early 2000s, particularly after the United States accused North Korea of pursuing a secret uranium enrichment programme in 2002. On 9 October 2006, North Korea conducted its first nuclear test, claiming to have detonated a nuclear device underground. The device was an implosion-type bomb using plutonium-239, with an estimated yield less than 1 kiloton of TNT, being significantly lower than other nations' first tests. North Korea conducted additional nuclear tests in 2009, 2013, 2016 (twice), and 2017. These tests demonstrated advancements in North Korea's nuclear capabilities, including miniaturisation of nuclear warheads and development of thermonuclear weapons. Alongside its nuclear tests, North Korea made significant progress in developing ballistic missiles, capable of reaching long-range targets including the United States mainland. Highprofile diplomatic efforts took place but these talks did not result in a concrete agreement to denuclearise. North Korea continues to develop its nuclear and missile programmes despite international sanctions and diplomatic efforts. The exact status and capabilities of its arsenal remain uncertain, but it is clear that North Korea maintains a significant nuclear capability.

Throughout the Cold War and





beyond various arms control treaties aimed at limiting the proliferation and testing of nuclear weapons have been signed. These included the Partial Test Ban Treaty (1963), the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty (NPT), Strategic Arms Limitation Talks (SALT I and II), Intermediate-Range Nuclear Forces Treaty (INF), and others. The Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty (NPT), signed in 1968, aimed to prevent the spread of nuclear weapons, promote peaceful uses of nuclear energy, and further the goal of disarmament. The deployment of intermediaterange SS-20 missiles in Europe heightened tensions and led to the NATO deployment of Pershing II and cruise missiles. The Strategic Arms Limitation Talks (SALT I and SALT II in 1972 and 1979) agreements were reached between the United States and the Soviet Union to limit the number of strategic ballistic missile launchers and other nuclear weapons. The 1980s saw renewed tensions but also significant arms control agreements, such as the Intermediate-Range Nuclear Forces (INF) Treaty signed in 1987 by Reagan and Gorbachev, which eliminated all intermediate-range and shorter-range nuclear and conventional missiles. The collapse of the Soviet Union in 1991 led to

the division of its nuclear arsenal among successor states, notably Russia, Ukraine, Kazakhstan, and Belarus. Efforts such as the Nunn-Lugar Cooperative Threat Reduction Program helped secure and dismantle nuclear weapons in these new states. The Strategic Arms Reduction Treaties (START I (1991) and START II (1993)) treaties between the United States and Russia aimed to further reduce and limit the number of deployed strategic nuclear weapons. The New START Treaty, signed in 2010, aims to further reduce deployed strategic nuclear weapons. But the spread of nuclear technology and ambitions of countries like North Korea and Iran pose ongoing challenges. Understanding the destructive power of nuclear weapons highlights the importance of nuclear disarmament and non-proliferation efforts to prevent the catastrophic consequences of their use.





To elucidate emotions more clearly, the American Psychological Association (APA) defines them as "conscious mental reactions (such as anger or fear) subjectively experienced as intense feelings, usually directed toward a specific object, and typically accompanied by physiological and behavioral changes in the body."

Emotions are intimately connected to individuals within relationships and the state of each relational bond can be derived from emotional interactions. However, psychology also identifies dependency behaviours that are observed in social and daily interactions. "In

psychology, dependency typically refers to a relationship characterised by an excessive reliance on other people (or substances) to satisfy emotional, physical, or psychological needs. It is often examined in the context of maladaptive behavior patterns such as pathological gambling or substance addiction.".

In today's context, observing relationship dynamics that encompass both emotions and dependency—known as emotional dependency—has become more complex. Emotional dependency is a critical aspect that we must recognise in ourselves and others during interactions. This condition often leads to heightened stress and pressure within a relationship.

Emotional dependency is further defined by its impacts on an individual. It arises when a person develops a belief that he needs a partner for survival, to feel fulfilled, or to feel complete. It is easy to mistake love for emotional dependency, as both

are characterised by intense feelings toward another person. In relationships, emotionally dependent individuals may believe they are "in love" when, in reality, they are "in need." Such individuals often seek constant attention, approval, and support from their partner.

Similarly, when discussing love, it is important to acknowledge its various meanings. In psychology, particularly in the modern context, love is described as "an emotion characterised by strong feelings of affection for another, arising from kinship, companionship, admiration, or benevolence. It may also denote a benevolent concern for the wellbeing of others. The term is further used to refer to sexual attraction or erotic desire toward another." Love, as a distinct emotion, has been studied across several scientific fields, including psychology, biology, neuroscience, anthropology, and sociology.

Being human today involves experiencing a wide range of



emotions and behaviors. However, the thoughts, feelings, and behaviours of some individuals may appear problematic, especially in the context of relationships. Therefore, understanding emotional dependency is crucial for all of us.

How we can understand Emotional Dependency:

To recognise this, some of the following characteristics will help,

- Feels: People you have dated in the past tend to seem ideal to you.
- Instead of focusing on your partner's appearance, project the person you want them to be.
- Creating the person you believe you love
- How this person could make me feel like a celebrity astounded me.
- Pay more attention to how the person you love treats you than to who they are.
- The feeling of your partner is accountable for your happiness, your worth, and your security
- Feels stressed and sometimes anxious during communications like no text messages. (not happening as per your expectations)
- Make a list of what your partner must do for you to feel safe and at ease.
- Feels or thinks incomplete or unable to do something without this person
- Afraid of missing your loved one
- Feel alone or abounded during your partner, not with attention or praise.


Friendly Badminton Tournament at Maradankeni




Army Inter-Regiment Bodybuilding, Weightlifting and Powerlifting Championship 2024
